Fruita on the list of 20 Coolest Towns for Outdoor Adventure

If you hadn't seen this already—check it out. The article blew up over social media this week, beginning over the weekend. We were number 12 on Matador Network's list and it highlighted favorite spots in Fruita, including the Over the Edge Sports, Cavalcade, Aspen Street Coffee, Hot Tomato, and the Copper Club Brewery. Thanks to Veronica Daehn Harvey for contributing information to Matador. Criteria for the rankings were: (1) The place should be an actual town, not just a spot or destination. In other words, you can live/work there year round, and even in the "off-season" it's still cool. (2) The outdoor objectives that make the place so rad must be part of the immediate surroundings. If you can't climb / ski / paddle / surf right in town, the access should be just beyond, not an hour away. And (3) The place should have a notable culture, tradition, or local economy around the activities (and natural resources) themselves. Of special mention are places such as Salida, where actual infrastructure has been developed (manmade whitewater features) that brings cool events and awareness to the town.

Downtown Enhancement Project Update

Unfortunately, we were not awarded our grant request of \$200,000 from the Mesa County Federal Mineral Lease District. Of the \$719,660 awarded, CMU received \$504,560 for the Tomlinson Library Renovation, Expansion and Technology project, and the remaining funds were awarded to mini-grant applications. We will still proceed with our project this summer in July and August. We will narrow our focus on the intersections of Peach and Mulberry and in between. Funds will be from what we budgeted and also received from DOLA. We will have to roll out the east end of Aspen intersection at the Circle in a future phase.

City Goals Update

In our efforts to narrow and align our efforts to achieve increased jobs, mixed use development and increased lodging tax revenue, we kicked off two working teams focused on proactive economic development, outdoor recreation, tourism, events and community engagement this week. GJEP and Chamber staff is working with us on these. As we progress, I will keep you updated.

Although many have been enjoying the Fruita Bike Park for a while now (including my kids and I), now that it is Spring we are having an official grand opening event to recognize and welcome representatives of Drought Response Information Project (DRIP), CSU Extension, WCCC and Great Outdoors Colorado (GOCO) Board Member Tom Burke. Mayor Buck will speak, and following the ceremony Officer Courtney will host youth races and prizes for fastest, most skilled and best sportsperson. The event starts at 10 am. Boy Scout Aaron Payne and his troop will recondition the park on Friday and early Saturday, Code Enforcement Officer Mark Angelo and volunteers from Partners will do cleanup and trail work. Math and Science Center in Fruita

Tuesday, the Math and Science Center held a press conference with the City and Chevron to celebrate a donation Chevron made of \$30,000 to help the MSC purchase laptops, a two 3-D printers and a 3-D scanner to be housed a the Fruita Business Incubator. They also announced their partnership with us to host science, technology, engineering and math programs right here in Fruita, at the Civic Center in June and July. Tuesday's North Star Economic Development Focus Group Meeting

We appreciate the engaged group of Fruitians who participated in the focus group Tuesday. The study, funded by the City of Grand Junction and Mesa County, will continue with the purpose of identifying a regional brand and message for the valley-wide economic development while maintain each city's identity. I have a follow-up call with Audrey Taylor of Chabin next week to drill down on Fruita specific economic development efforts/opportunities. One thing that was for certain was the consultants were highly impressed with Fruita as a community and Fruita is not in search of an identity.






