The next regular City election will be held on April 3, 2018. The election will be conducted by mail ballot and ballots will be mailed out to registered voters the week of March 12, 2018. The City of Fruita now has a 24-hour mail ballot drop box located in the Civic Center east parking lot where you can drive right up to drop off your ballot.

The ballot will include the election of a Mayor and three City Council members. There are two candidates running for the Mayor's seat and five candidates for the three Council positions available.

In addition, the ballot will also include a TABOR revenue retention question.

CANDIDATES FOR MAYOR:

MIKE DURDEN

I grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio where I studied sociology at the University of Cincinnati. From there I moved to Dallas Texas in 1998 where I met my wife of 18 years. CAROLYN GAMBINO

I relocated to pursue an education and acquired a BS in Biology as well as advanced degrees in blood transfusion medicine. After 20 years in clinical medicine during which I served as director of transfusion medicine laboratories throughout the US. I switched focus and worked as Vice President of Worldwide Technical Services for Immucor. Inc. an international leader in the blood transfusion medical device industry, managing seven divisions across North America and Europe. After my semiretirement, I served in a volunteer capacity as the Director of Canine Health and Wellness for Adopt a Golden Atlanta, the largest international non-profit rescue for Golden Retrievers, and continue to advocate for and support canine rescue efforts. I have served as the Mayor for the last six years and prior to that I served on City Council for 6 years, 4 of those years as Mayor Pro-tem. I have served on the Police Commission, Senior Task Force, Planning Commission, Parks and Recreation Board, Tourism Board, and the Arts & Culture Board. I participated in the Community Plan update, the Land Use Code update, and two Tabor Review Committees. I was a participant in the development of the Parks and Open Space Plan and the Economic Development Plan.

I am term limited as Mayor, but I feel like I have a lot more to contribute to keep pushing Fruita forward. I will continue to ensure that the city remains fiscally responsible, that the small town character of Fruita is preserved while supporting the local economy and that growth is managed in a manner to protect citizen's interest.
