WEEKLY INFO UPDATE Re:

Tuesday's City Council Meeting

Tuesday night we will kick off the call for public hearing on the 2016 annual budget with a rundown of final budget changes resulting from the previous series of budget meetings we have had. Also on the agenda is short presentation and request to approve a DOLA grant application to partner with the Center for Priority Based Budgeting beginning in January of 2016. The letter to the County regarding the TDR program and an item to discuss Counselor Fuller's resignation is also on the agenda.

Fruita's Inaugural 0.038 Marathon & Rim Rock Marathon a Success

The Rim Rock Marathon finished at Circle Park in Fruita this year and feedback has been positive so we hope to grow this event for years to come. The marathon had 260 runners and our first 0.038 Marathon had 52 runners.

Little Salt Wash Trail Construction

Monday was the CDOT hearing on the low bidder's appeal of CDOT not concurring with their effort to meet the DBE goal for the project and CDOT did not grant the appeal. This means we must re-advertise for bids which begin this weekend for two weeks. We will have a pre-bid meeting on Dec. 1 and the bid opening on Dec. 8. On December 10, GOCO will hear and vote on our request for a grant extension. Assuming all goes well, construction would then begin in late February and end around the end of May.

Outdoor Coalition Event

We had a great showing from Fruita at the Outdoor Coalition event Thursday—with Mayor Buck, Counselor Bonar, all directors and myself and local businesses The Hot Tomato, Back Country Biker and Over the Edge. Fruita was complemented on our efforts in abundance by local businesses and Luis Benitez and Ken Gart.

TID BITS:

- We will be clearing some of the proposed Kokopelli Trailway to allow for surveying.
- The Mayor and staff met with local CDOT officials this week to cover hurdles the city has come across in trail building efforts.
- Staff is working with BLM and the Mesa County Graffiti program to remove graffiti found on BLM property.
- Due to the recent Mesa County-Grand Junction Wireless Master Plan, staff is working on proposed amendments to the land use code to incorporate this plan.



- Staff is also working on an update to the sign ordinance to take to Planning Commission in December.
- I will be meeting with all city employees next week to cover the 2016 budget.
- The Police Department will be seeking funding for security cameras near the PD and Municipal Court from the Forfeiture Board.
- The FCC had 343 paid visitors in November and 147,302 for the year so far.
- Sales tax revenues were up 2.42% in October over 2014 putting us at -6.36 % for the year.
- We received \$1,461.86 in sales tax from vendors during Fall Festival.
