WEEKLY INFO UPDATE

City Offices closed for Thanksgiving holiday on Thursday & Friday, Nov. 26-27. Happy Thanksgiving!

Tuesday's City Council Meeting

Tuesday's agenda includes a couple second readings on ordinance changes, the resolutions associated with adopting the 2016 budget and a conditional use permit. The CUP is somewhat odd because it is recommended by staff and the Planning Commission to deny because the application is incomplete. As Code Enforcement worked with the applicant through the City's community outreach program, there was intent to pay the CUP fee and staff went ahead and advertised and placed the CUP on the Planning Commission's agenda. As it turned out, we never received the fee, making it an incomplete application that normally wouldn't go to Planning Commission or City Council, but Planning Commission heard it since it had been advertised and denied it—moving it to City Council. Staff has been encouraging the applicant to pay the fee to no avail.

Dinosaur Diamond Revival

CDOT has hired a contractor to assess signage and wayfinding for scenic byways, including the Colorado segment of Dinosaur Diamond (from Rangely to Fruita to Grand Junction to Delta). Judy Walden of Walden Mills is conducting the study. Community Development Director Dahna Raugh will be participating in the assessment to represent Fruita Tuesday – Wednesday in the field. There is also an exit interview scheduled for Wednesday, Dec. 3rd at Dinosaur Journey that you are all invited to attend at 3:30 pm in their auditorium. The interview will focus on the teams' evaluation of the signage and ease of finding sites and all museum staff, representatives from the City of Fruita and the Chamber are invited to join to discuss what the teams found. They need an RSVP soon, so please let Deb know by Monday morning if you plan to attend.

- 2 of 3 new police vehicles this year are up-fitted and ready for use. The third will be ready in a few weeks. We should also have the new vactor truck in the next couple weeks. The new dump truck is delayed and should be received in Jan.
- Public works is pre-staging the Mulberry Road closure from Aspen to the alleyway for the FFA Christmas Tree Lot sales and will close it on Friday.

Buy your Christmas tree in downtown Fruita Event celebrates hometown feel of season

For the second year, Fruita residents can buy their Christmas trees in downtown Fruita.

The Downtown Fruita Christmas Tree Lot – run by FFA students from Fruita Monument High School – will be open from **3 p.m. on Nov. 27 to 3 p.m. on Dec. 6**. **Daily hours will be 9 a.m. – 9 p.m.**

The City of Fruita will close a portion of Mulberry Street just north of Aspen Street to accommodate the lot. The trees will be in between Suds Bros. and Cavalcade.

Band students from Fruita's 8/9 School and Fruita Monument High School will perform throughout both weekends of the sale.

Organizers hope community members will gather at the tree lot as they wish to sing carols or play music in honor of the holiday season.

"I am excited about the Christmas tree lot happening in downtown Fruita for the second year," said Jeannine Purser, chairwoman of Fruita's Downtown Advisory Board. "My very favorite thing about Fruita is that it's a small town. This idea just accentuates the small-town magic that Fruita has to offer.

Prices of trees will range from \$25-\$100. Cash or check only. Donations also will be accepted for FFA's annual state and national competitions.
