Fruita's Inaugural 0.038 Marathon & Rim Rock Marathon—Nov. 7th

The Rim Rock Marathon finish line will end at Circle Park – runners are expected in Fruita starting around 11:00 am. The 0.038 will be from 9:00-10:30 am and will have 5 races— the last is a family run starting at 10:20 am. Runners start at Circle Park, run a half mile and turn around and finish at Circle Park. At Circle Park, there will also be vendors, a beer garden (Rotary) and live music (The Navigators from Cavalcade) from 12:00-2:00 pm. We're excited to create a fun event for the community that also supports cheering on the runners finishing the grueling Rim Rock Marathon. I think I will go for the .038 Marathon. The Fruita 0.038 Marathon entry is \$10.00 per person (may participate in two categories).

- The Boards and Commissions Appreciation Night Monday turned out to be a very nice night for those volunteers who were able to attend and receive their gift and enjoy some pie and socializing.
- Mesa County Commissioners are holding three Town Hall meetings on their proposed budget (one beginning at the Fruita Community Center Nov. 9th from 5:30 – 6:30 pm). See the release below if interested in more details.
- The appeal hearing is for the low bidder on the Little Salt Wash Trail construction process is Monday. Depending on the outcome we may need to re-bid, which we will do working closely with CDOT on a realistic DBE goal and have a low bidder before we request the official grant extension from the GOCO Board on December 10th.
- Cindy Epple will be retiring mid-December so please make sure to thank her for her service. After review of this part-time position, we did decide to fill it and received 80+ applications we are currently reviewing.
- In recognition of the many veterans who serve our country, the FCC is offering a free pass to veterans Wednesday for Veterans Day.
- Staff is looking into hosting a golf tournament in partnership with the Rotary Club and Adobe Creek for the purpose of raising funds to cover youth scholarship summer passes at the FCC.
- The pavilion roof of the stage was removed this week due to poor condition and staff will design improvements and construct prior to Fat Tire Festival in the spring.
- Staff is reviewing the pre-bills sent to us by GVDD.
- Public Works Director Ken Haley spoke this week to the local and statewide contractor's associations about our capital projects for 2016 and received much interest.
- October yielded another 3 residential units permits, totaling 29 for the year (Full report attached).




The draft budget was presented in public hearing on Oct. 12. Final adoption of the 2016 budget is planned for Dec. 7 at 9 a.m.




