Tuesday's City Council Workshop

Tuesday night, we will meet with the Department Directors to focus on the goal-setting process at 6:30 pm.

TID BITS:

• Engineering will begin designing improvements to the alley north of Aspen in downtown as the Little Salt Wash Trail project wraps up.

• Fruita Reservoir 2 is being surveyed monthly and monitored twice a week,

still showing signs of minor movement.

- Mesa County is currently designing a new bridge for Maple.
- BLM is reviewing the Kokopelli Trail design.

• Fencing on the Little Salt Wash Trail is wrapping up and graffiti is being removed today in the underpasses.

• The siding work at the FCC is postponed until after July 4.

• The ADA door at the FCC in between the indoor pool and outdoor pool is installed.

• We continue to have irrigation problems around the City due primarily to moss plugging up the canals. Staff is cleaning the head gates often and working with the GVIC.

• Country Jam generously donated about 12 trees and 30 bushes to the City that will be well used.

• Bike to Work Day and the Hospital's breakfast at the FCC occurred on Wednesday.

- Tonight is the first Food Truck Friday of the season on fourth Fridays.
- Tomorrow begins the season of Farmers' Markets each Saturday.
- Next Thursday's concert in the park is when City Council will serve the public

Save the date: Refurbished state-line marker will be dedicated June 25

Historic marker will find new home along I-70

Work is nearing completion on the restoration of a historical marker that was once celebrated at the state line between Colorado and Utah.

On June 25, the marker, which had become a canvas for graffiti, gunshots and other abuse, will be celebrated in its new home near the Colorado-Utah state line on the south, or eastbound, side of Interstate 70.

Members of the public are invited to celebrate the unveiling of the refurbished marker.

What: Ceremony celebrating the refurbished state-line marker
When: Saturday, June 25, 10 a.m.
Where: Colorado-Utah state line, eastbound I-70
How: Grand Valley Transit will provide transportation from the Rabbit Valley parking lot in the McInnis Canyons National Conservation Area. To get there from Grand Junction, travel west on I-70 and take exit 2. Immediately turn left onto Rabbit Valley Road to reach the Rabbit Valley Trailhead. Attendees should arrive at the parking lot between 9:30-9:45 a.m.

Because the event will take place on the side of the Interstate, parking will be very limited on site. Organizers encourage attendees to utilize the GVT shuttle from Rabbit Valley.

"This is such an important piece of Mesa County history," said Commissioner Scott McInnis, who led the efforts to restore the marker. "We're really excited to see it properly restored."
