You'll remember that we were the large town who won multiple rounds of online voting last year to become Colorado's Best Adventure Town on Elevation Outdoor's poll. - GVDD dislodged some roots in K Road drain, has relieved Holly Park flooding.
- In preparation for our grant request to Mesa County Federal Mineral Lease District, we have begun meeting with business owners about the alley improvement project.
- We submitted our waste water application and will be requesting to opt out of Regulation 85 requirements based on in-stream standards.
- Reservoir 2 drilling is underway and we are able to reduce monitoring.
- We are working with our water attorney to submit our due diligence application.
- BLM signed the Decision Record this week authorizing the new trails to be built at Mack Ridge (map below).
- We are working with local businesses, BLM, COPMOBA and an REI grant to hopefully get these built this fall.




