TID BITS:

- Fruita Fall Festival starts today! Great line up of entertainment Georgia Satellites on Friday and Mr. Worley on Saturday.
- We submitted a CYCA grant application (utilizing GOCO funds) for three WCCC crew weeks of work to clear and treat tamarisk and Russian olive along the Big Salt Wash Greenway. If approved, work will take place in the Spring.
- The FCC opened back up Monday after a week of maintenance and looks fabulous!
 - New partitions in locker room showers turned out great, floors look awesome and all the dust bunnies, smudges, and general grim have been cleaned up.
 - All fitness equipment was serviced over 5.5 years of use, patrons have put on 30,000 miles per treadmills - service contractor said we have heavy use - confirmed what we already thought.
 - New kids play feature for the shallow depth entry area (replacing buckets, etc.) was not installed during maintenance week but did arrive this week. It is being scheduled and will be installed in the very near future (after hours).
- We received word from GOCO that our Kokopellin section of the Riverfront Trail construction grant application for \$2 million is ranked #2 of 9 finalists and being recommended for approval to the board--they meet and vote on Oct. 7 and we will have staff in attendance.
- Parks & Recreation Director, Ture Nycum, also represented Fruita this week speaking at the statewide Parks Association co freebie held in GJ.
- Thanks to Councilman Kincaid and Odette Brach for attending the Governor's conference on Tourism last week partnering with the GJ VCB and Town of Palisade. They represented Fruita well helping with a booth highlighting Fruita and the Grand Valley in preparation for hosting the conference next year.
- The Gateway Enhancement Open house was Monday night and we had a very low turnout.
 Fortunately we received much feedback during the earlier stages of the project with the packets completed at local businesses and the consultant is now finalizing conceptual designs fro the feedback.

- Should be receiving schematic layouts for the Downtown Streetscape Phase II soon and will be taking those down to businesses to discuss the plan and get feedback.
- Overlays Concrete bulb-outs for the crosswalk on Coulson were poured. Some of the concrete work did not meet the plan grades and had to come out and be re-poured (at the expense of the contractor).
- Utility work continues on Roberson. Once utilities are completed, milling will start for all of overlays.
- Currently seeking bids/proposals for the LOMR for Little Salt Wash after completing the Little Salt Wash Trail and making changes to the channel. The LOMR will revise the floodplain mapping for the wash.
- Aspen alley design continues. Last week, Public Works performed pothole locates of utilities in the alley and in Mulberry Street and Pabor Avenue along the proposed storm drain alignment to determine conflicts.
- Slats in the fencing at the Railroad Culvert still remain from Western Workman for Little Salt Wash Trail. They were supposed to complete that last week, but have not done so as of yet.
- Fruita made the cover of *Municipal Sewer & Water* magazine. A special thanks to John Carrillo and all our wastewater staff for their hard work in supporting the utility needs of the City in such a professional manner. <u>http://www.mswmag.com/ezine/2016/10?ref=header</u>
- Public Works is in process of reviewing over 20 applications received for the open Maintenance Worker I position.
- Friday is Mike Gentry's last day. We wish him the best as he moves on.
- We have two employees attending street sweeper operation and maintenance school next week in Waco, TX, which was included in the price of purchasing our new street sweeper.
- Should be getting initial concepts for lagoon redevelopment next week with intent to roll out to boards and commissions in early October.
- Mesa County is coordinating a walk audit for schools as part of Safe Routes to School Program.
 They will be including Rimrock Elementary and Fruita Middle School this year. We participate with them at different schools each year.
- Police Commission is this Wednesday, 09/21/16. We're giving a plaque to Ernest Griffiths who has been on the commission for 14 years! He's taking a break from the commission and we have a couple of people are interested.
- A new volunteer started in Police Records this week.

- Chief Macy also represented Fruita this week participating on an Ethics panel at the WCCC POST Academy.
- PST Carrie Benham is organizing a Feral Cat Forum, to be held at the FCC on Oct. 22nd.
- There was a major upgrade to our Computer Assisted Dispatch and Records Management System this week.




