City offices will be closed for Thanksgiving on Thursday and Friday, Nov. 24-25 next week.

One Million Paid Visitors

Wednesday at about 1 pm, Fruita resident Alan Ronning scanned his pass as the one millionth paid visitor while entering with his wife. Members since 2012, they will now receive a free annual pass. Staff surprised them with confetti, cake, lemonade and Channel 11 News recorded the moment live (Photos below).

Tomorrow, Saturday, Nov. 19 at 11 am come cheer on the Fruita Monument Football Team as they parade through downtown prior to their big playoff game—Go Wildcats!

TID BITS:

- Busy with economic development efforts during last week: 2 proposals to prospects and 3 new prospect meetings and tours.
- Staff will be reviewing past traffic counts and evaluating and comparing current patterns at the intersection of Aspen and Mulberry.
- The Sports Commission was successful in being awarded a Colorado Tourism Office grant of \$25,000 matched by half the contributions provided by public funding partners (Fruita, GJ, Palisade, Mesa County) to be used for marketing the area for events (improved digital presence, industry tradeshow participation, community venue videos and promotional & collateral materials).
- Unfortunately, the joint grant request to the CTO we participated in with the VCB and Palisade was not awarded.
 - Employees raised \$1,800 for United Way in our internal campaign.

Honor the Past – Envision the Future FRUITA

- Board of Adjustment met Thursday for the first time since 2014 and approved a variance in the Red Cliffs subdivision.
- Planning Commission will meet in December to continue training.
- Police Officers participated in night driving training.
- City Engineer Sam Atkins met with the CO Contractors' Association and Western Colorado Contractors' Association to share capital projects we have for 2017.
- We are receiving bids for the Little Salt Wash Trail to stabilize a section of the bank.
- We received a new draft of the Gateway enhancements to review and provided feedback to the contractor to prepare for a presentation to City Council Dec. 6.
- Staff met with the Dam Inspector regarding Reservoir 2. We will discuss options at the upcoming workshop.
- We are at 60% design of the Kokopelli section of the Riverfront Trail.
- Met with trail partners (BLM, COPMOBA, local businesses) about ongoing projects.
- The re-route to Wrangler is completing today and we plan a Dec. 1 opening.
- The next section of trail to construct will be a new route on Mack Ridge that will cost about \$55,500 and \$26,000 is already secured. Fundraising efforts lead by COPMOBA are also underway.
