Tuesday's City Council Meeting

The consent agenda includes a liquor license renewal and also annexation second readings for Aspen Village subdivision. We have a public hearing on the 2017 proposed budget and two administrative reports: update and discussion on the lagoon redevelopment project and a developer request for an exception regarding a credit for the parks, open space and trails impact fee.

Rim Rock Marathon and Fruita 0.038

Cool temps and light rain made for great running weather for this year's Rim Rock Marathon. Registrations sold out a week ahead of time with 430 registered. 373 participated on race day (136 in the full marathon; 213 in the half marathon including our own Councilman Kincaid at 25th place—go Joel!; and 24 in the relay). Runners came from 23 different states. Circle Park, vendors, live music, beer garden and supporters cheering on made for a great finish point as well. The City's companion 0.038 Marathon (the one I did [©]) hosted about 83 runners in the men's women's and family runs. - Engineering is also busy working on design of the alleyway project, gateway enhancement, downtown phase 2 and the dam at reservoir 2.
- US Tractor is beginning to put up steel for framing and still shooting for a March opening.
- We are less than 3,000 visits to reaching our millionth paid visitor at the Community Center.
- We had a great meeting with Family Health West this week discussing partnerships in our recruitment efforts.
- September sales tax numbers were down 10.42% compared to Sept. 2015. This includes some missing distributions that will come in the next month or were included in August. Overall we are 1.35% up compared to 2015 year to date.
