This Saturday, Nov. 5 is the Rim Rock Marathon

(http://www.rimrockmarathon.com/index.html) that will end in Circle Park. For the first time ever, the race (with the exception of our 0.038 marathon) has sold out! See press release below. Registration began today at the Community Center from 3-7 pm. We have some nice Fruita swag that will be in the participant packets for those running in the marathon or the half-marathon. We also have the Fruita 0.038 Marathon on Aspen Avenue that starts and ends at Circle Park—this includes a men's, women's or family fun run and the cost is \$10 and these races begin at 10 am with registration at 9 am. We hope to see many locals at Circle Park to enjoy the festivities and cheer the runners on.

2016 US Bank Rim Rock Run Registration Sells Out

GRAND JUNCTION, COLO., NOV. 2, 2016 — For the first time in race history, the 2016 U.S. Bank Rim Rock Run has hit its registration cap. Four hundred runners have registered for this year's race, to be held Saturday morning, Nov. 5 over the Colorado National Monument (a unit of the national park system) and finishing in downtown Fruita, Colo.

"As the host community for the US Bank Rim Rock Marathon, the City of Fruita is excited about the growth of this race and to see that it has reached capacity for 2016," commented City of Fruita Mayor Lori Buck. "It's a spectacularly beautiful race through the Colorado National Monument and we are very happy that it ends at Circle Park in downtown Fruita. We certainly hope people come down to the race finish to cheer on these amazing athletes."

Increased interest in the race, which is organized by the Greater Grand Junction Sports Commission (GGJSC) with help from Colorado Mesa University, is due in part to the addition of a half marathon from the top of the Monument into Fruita. Another first for the race, the half-marathon will draw approximately 230 runners on Saturday. The Rim Rock Run also includes a full marathon, marathon relay, and a one-mile fun run — the Fruita 0.038 Marathon — for the community.

"The half marathon was a big draw for runners, and the high registration numbers really speak to the race's reputation as a beautiful, high-quality event," said Jennifer Stoll, executive director of the GGJSC.

Twice voted "Most Scenic Marathon" by "Colorado Runner," the Rim Rock Run has attracted registrants from across the country. Most of the runners the race brings to the greater Grand Junction area are from Colorado, but 21 states are represented in this year's events.

The Rim Rock Run's courses wind past the Colorado National Monument's canyons, monoliths and plateaus, ending in downtown Fruita's Circle Park. A festival at the finish line features vendors, live music and a beer garden. Runners and supporters alike are invited to join in the celebration and spectators 21 years and up can enter the beer garden with the purchase of a \$10 commemorative cup.

Although registration for the full marathon, half marathon and marathon relay are closed, the Fruita 0.038 Marathon will take on site registrations starting at 9am on Saturday morning at Circle Park. The one mile run will feature a Men's Open at 10am, a Women's Open at 10:30am, and a Family Fun Run at 10:40am.

Please note that due to the race hitting its registration cap, there will not be any on-site registration on the morning of the race. Proceeds from the Rim Rock Run benefit CMU's Track and Cross Country programs and the Greater Grand Junction Sports Commission.


