- Road base is being laid on the Laura-Pabor alley project and should complete next week.
- Xcel Energy quit-claimed a small parcel near the lake in the business park that is on the agenda for Tuesday.
- Aspen Village is awaiting their stormwater permit from the state and anxious to get started.
- Public Works crews continue to work on the new path to Snook's Bottom and we are close to putting in road base and two culverts.
- The fire at Snook's actually has had a positive impact in many ways, clearing out weeds and opening up access to utilize a week of Conservation Corp labor to clear out much more Tamarisk!
- The lights on the billboard are not functioning properly and under warranty so staff is working on getting those fixed ASAP.
- The bar screen at the WWRF has been ordered.
- Public Works and Parks staff will attend CPR training next week.
- Staff completed the remodel of the old Chamber room—now the dance room in the Civic Center.
- Crews completed a number of re-striping parking lines in the downtown area.
- GVRTC Board has decided to meet every other month now.
- The irrigation canals will begin to fill next week and the City system in the core of the City will turn on April 10.
- The new trash cleaners have been installed on the Encanto irrigation line.
- Staff received training from the US Army Corps of Engineers this week.
- We continue to work with two solid business prospects and Planning has been busy with various permits, VRBOs, and housing developments.
- Today the Police Department conducted a promotional process for the vacant Corporal position.
- PD is also interviewing applicants for Police Officer.
- Our internal, cross-departmental Action Item Teams continue to meet and make progress.
- Margaret has been working hard on the annual Financial Statements and nearing completion.
- The indoor pool at the Community Center is completely open and the Kiddie pool slide is once again being fixed under warranty for one more try.
- We host the Chamber Business Expo next week at the Community Center Thursday from 4-7 pm.
- I was able to talk all about Fruita on KAFM Tuesday in the Community Affairs segment. Ture recently did so too and when we have access to the podcasts, we'll share them with you.
- I was also able to attend the Grand Valley Food Hub Forum and express Fruita's interest in being the location for the Food Hub.

Avoided 108 Metric Tons of Greenhouse Gas Emissions




227,566 Gallons of Water

Rabbit Valley is a motorized trail system that winds along the rim of the Colorado River, and offers short and long trail experiences that range from easy to moderate in difficulty.
