Interesting New Business in 2016 Stats

In 2016, we issued 635 business licenses (not including special event business licenses). 107 of these were new business licenses. Of the 107 new licenses, 25 were for businesses in the downtown and commercial areas of the city and 33 were for home occupations.

- The City is once again a Tree city USA (one of 3,400 communities) for our priority of tree planting.
- Today, a scheduled XCEL power outage occurred on 18 Road (south of the I-70 Frontage Rd.)— XCEL conducted outbound calls to impacted residents Thursday evening and Public Works had a generator ready for the lift station in the area.
- The Colorado Outdoor Recreation Industry Office and Something Independent have launched a survey to help explain what makes the outdoor recreation business community so special: http://www.surveygizmo.com/s3/3364455/c408b2bfb956
- We issued a new certificate of occupancy for a coffee shop at 340 Highway 6&50 called Heavenly Grounds.

- We are planning with COPMOBA, BLM, local businesses on a grand open date for the new mountain bike trail on Mack Ridge that will be named Hawkeye—the grand opening will likely be during Fat Tire Festival weekend.
- The Mayor and I were able to attend the Western Colorado Outdoor Industry Leadership Summit this week.
- The City's Youth Scholarship Golf Tournament was a hit today, raising funds for youth recreation programs and passes to the community center.
- Last night was a successful Business Expo put on by the Chamber at the Community Center that Councilor Kincaid and I were able to speak at.
- Letters have gone out to residents from the Girls on the Run regarding their upcoming race in Fruita (2500+ runners) beginning at Shelledy Elementary between 10 – 11 am.
- Engineering staff is going through a selection process to have a summer intern through a grant from the American Public Works Association.
- We had two new seasonal Public Works employees start Monday and 3 will begin next week (3 are returning from last season).
- Open positions we are in various stages of recruitment including a wastewater operator, two police officers and a part-time animal control officer.
- The city's logo is in the trademark process.
- The Community Center remains busy after its busiest year in 2016, 1,000 visits over 2016 this year through March.
- March FCC visits were 461 over March of 2016.
- Parks is working with Lower Valley Fire Department and the BLM Fire to do a planned burn at Snooks that will also serve as training.

- The Western Colorado Conservation Corp has been at Snooks this week removing Tamarisk in an area opened up by the recent fire.
- Unfortunately, the underpass on Little Salt Wash trail was tagged with graffiti again by a talented artist ©. We are actually working with CDOT on a planned project in the same area.
- Spring sports programs are in full action.
- The Communities that Cares Leadership committee training will be all morning Monday.
- The Mayor and I will then spend the afternoon assisting with the School Superintendent hiring process.
- People for Bikes is out at trailheads doing the e-bike surveys.
- Aspen Village and Adobe View North subdivisions have begun construction.
- While there were no dwelling unit permits issued in March, we have just under 400 submitted.
- The Laura-Pabor alley road base is complete.
- Overlay door hangers went out to impacted residents.
- Big thanks to the City of Grand Junction for assisting and saving us money to install a force main 10 inch sewer tap.
- Kudos to the City of Palisade for donating skate park material that can aid ours now that they are constructing a concrete park.
- We submitted an AGNC grant application today for the improved crosswalk at Pabor and Pine that we had budgeted this year, but need an extra \$5,000 to make it happen. This will move the crosswalk to the north side of Pabor aligning with the two paved trails and create a refuge island in the middle of Pine.


