Tuesday's City Council Meeting

The agenda kicks off with a few proclamations: Police Week, Armed Forces Day and Public Lands Day. Then we will hear a short presentation by Mesa County Public Health Department on their Connectedness initiative. We have a fairly light agenda from there with only the consent agenda and updates.

Saturday's 5th Annual Fruita History Fair (from the Historic Preservation Board)

The Fruita Historic Preservation Board will host the fifth annual Fruita History Fair at Cavalcade, 201 East Aspen Avenue, Fruita, from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., on Saturday, May 13. There is no charge. There will be displays of historic artifacts and photographs, covering the importance of agriculture, ranching, business, families, schools, houses, the railroad, water, and Colorado National Monument to Fruita and the Grand Valley. We will have a then-and-now photograph display, a continuous digital slide show, free Fruita History Coloring & Activity Books for children, period music played on an Edison cylinder phonograph, and more. The Lower Valley Heritage Room in the Fruita Civic Center, 325 East Aspen Avenue, will also be open. Board members will identify and scan or photograph historic artifacts, photographs, and postcards brought in by the public. Attendees are encouraged to bring in such artifacts and photographs and to ask questions. Iron Wheel Subdivision

At the May 9th Planning Commission meeting, Iron Wheel requested that their Sketch Plan application for 276 residential lots be continued so they could work out some issues. It was continued to an unspecified date, but not to exceed six months. There were several surrounding property owners attending the PC meeting, and because they made the effort to attend the meeting, the PC took public comments on Iron Wheel. One person spoke and was concerned about traffic, noise, density, sewer

service for his property, etc.

New Development

Recent submittals include a PUD amendment for Gewont Townhouses, a Major Subdivision application for the Harrison Townhouses, a couple of VRBOs in residential areas, and an annexation. We are finishing up the Friedly/Young Minor Subdivision, a Site Design Review approval for an industrial storage yard on River Road and another one for a Self Service Ice Vending building at the Shell station, and the Greenway Property Line Adjustment on Greenway Drive.

Repairs at the Community Center

A compressor to repair the HVAC #4 has been ordered and will be installed as soon as parts are in. Two brand new AMT exercise units are ordered and should be here within a couple weeks to replace two older, popular models that have been down for multiple weeks. Staff continues to work with Charter Communications to fix the TV issues caused by a Charter upgrade and old Charter boxes we have. New boxes are being installed this week. Two basketball hoops have been out of commission and staff is working on getting those fixed ASAP. The kiddie slide is being modified and repaired in Denver. The FCC is busy and school groups are enjoying field trips to use the outdoor pool.

TID BITS:

- A new tree was planted at Rim Rock Elementary today and Mayor Pro-tem Bonar officiated (photos below).
- City sales tax revenue in March was up 14% compared to March of 2016. Year to date we are up 6.6% through March v. 2016 of same period.
- Lots of upcoming events listed below.
- The City was awarded \$2,500 of the requested \$5,000 grant from AGNC for assistance with the Pabor-Pine crosswalk project.
- Our two new officers, Dillon Chilcote and Logan Hunt, started this week. Both just graduated the WCCC POST Academy last week. Dillon comes to us with several years of experience as a detentions deputy in the Mesa County jail, and Logan is a US Army veteran. Dillon and Logan are great additions to the department.
- The I-70 force main project will begin advertising for bids May 14, with a pre-bid meeting May 30 and bid opening June 7.
- Engineering has interviews scheduled this week with CMU students for the 2017 engineering summer internship program.
- All striping and signage for ADA parking is complete at Snooks Bottom.
- Dry Utilities are installed at new Adobe View North subdivision.
- Most of the sanitary sewer has been installed, storm drainage being installed this week at new Aspen village subdivision.
- Filing 2D of Brandon Estates construction began this week.
- 90% design meeting for Kokopelli Section of the Riverfront trail was held this week.

- The next City Link draft is at the designer.
- Working with staff who need to be at the Mountain water and land discussion, we are planning on hosting the public meeting from 4-6 pm Friday, June 2 prior to the night festivities at Mike the Headless Chicken Festival.
- The Sno Shack got their temporary use permit so clearly summer time is on its way!
- Our internal Education team is working with the Fruita Rotary Club to provide food to kids throughout the summer on Friday afternoons at 4 distribution sites—staff will help at Fruita Bike Park and Heritage Park.
- The Girls on the Run event last Saturday was successful with 2,000+ people participating in the 5k event in Fruita.
- Parks staff is staying busy fixing multiple irrigation line breaks at the parks and dealing with pressure issues.
- As a follow-up to the Sea Otter trip, we are working on a large number of action items and follow-up with companies.
- We continue to assist a couple serious business prospects in their business relocations/starts. The Business Incubator has been a huge help with these.
- Slate Communications will be in town Monday and Tuesday hosting local business at two
 workshops regarding the City's marketing strategy, educating on social media tools and kicking
 off a social media cross-promotion strategy. Workshop times are in the calendar below.
