• This update is going out early as tomorrow I will be speaking at the Grand Valley Leadership Academy in the morning, supporting the Chamber Leadercast event most of the day before ending with meetings in GJ.

• Thanks Mayor Buck, Mayor Pro-tem Bonar and Councilman Karisny for joining me to engage with the Fruita Fat Tire Festival vendors last Friday.

• The grand opening of the new mountain bike trial Hawkeye last Friday drew a large crowd, including Councilman Karisny and City staff. The City's roll and partnerships with BLM, COPMOBA, GVTA, local businesses, and grants from agencies like REI were highlighted and the trail is amazing.

• Fat Tire Festival was a success, no issues, new companies involved, and the rain held off. Thanks to Over the Edge Sports for making that happen.

• Good luck to the Mayor and her team riding in the 18 Hours of Fruita race this weekend!

• Thanks to each you on the City Council for enduring two Council meetings this week. The meeting with the School District Board and staff was very productive and detailed info on how the upcoming bond and mill levy proposals will impact Fruita students and schools is forthcoming.

• I had the opportunity to give the morning announcements at Shelledy Elementary this week and thank the teachers for Teacher Appreciation Week that was proclaimed by each of you Tuesday night.

• Saturday night the City was recognized by Family Health West with the prestigious Ruth B. Wyper Award "In recognition of outstanding contributions and collaboration with the Lower Valley Hospital Association". Mayor Buck, Councilmen Brackett and Kincaid and I were there to accept.

Honor the Past – Envision the Future FRUITA

- New Fruita Walking Tour brochures are now available at the Civic Center and Community Center.
- This Saturday the City will be swarmed with over 2,500 visitors participating in the annual Girls on the Run race.
- Here are a couple updates from the Colorado National Monument:

<u>The Half Tunnel project</u> - work is progressing slightly ahead of schedule. The necessary rock scaling is complete, work on the culvert is underway, and next week the contractors will begin the final phases of the project.

<u>Masonry wall work</u> - The Masonry crew is continuing to repoint the wall just below Fruita Canyon overlook. Repointing is basically adding mortar to the joint spaces between the stones. Work should wrap up late next week. The crew will then move to the wall just above Fruita Canyon overlook.

<u>Roadway shoulder work</u> - today a crew will be working near Artist Point beginning to clear debris from the roadway shoulders. Work will involve moving silt and rocks that have come down into the drainage ditches beside the roadway.

Temporary traffic control will be in place for all three work sites with minimal delays - typically less than five minutes

- FYI, Rick Taggart is now the Grand Junction Mayor.
- Overlays complete, working on some seeding at Snooks Bottom.
- Engineering is very busy assisting HOAs with irrigation issues, designing multiple projects and assisting in residential development reviews and inspections.
- Aspen Village subdivision continues to work on sewer.
- Adobe View North subdivision is paved.
- The State Park began their portion of trail construction early that connects to the Little Salt Wash Trail and hope to be complete by middle of June. They may have the funding to extend the trail in the park this fall.
- We had an interesting conference call with a developing firm that focuses on public-private partnerships and will continue to investigate options.
- Congrats to March Employee of the Month Todd Patton!
- Congrats to April Employee of the Month Bill Wulff!
- Congrats to May Employee of the Month Tim Russell!
- Also congratulations to our two new Police Officers graduating from the Police Academy May 5th, Dillon Chilicote & Robert Hunt!
- Congrats to Matt Haifley, our newest Wastewater Operator, who already passed his Class D Test!
- We had 5 new residential dwelling units permitted in April and code enforcement is picking up. See full report below.
- Community Development is slammed with multiple project reviews!
- PD and the County are working together to address urban camping in areas near the river where it is not permitted.

- Sergeant Coughran is taking a class at CMU where he wrote a short story that was published in the CMU Literary Review and he received an award for it as well—Congrats!
- Mark and Dave's daughters perform with Express All Stars and recently ranked 9th in the world!
- Proposals responding to our request for Bond Writers are in. Request for proposals for Bond Counsel has been issued and due next week.
- Our new auditing firm and staff have been busy in office all week.
- We released a joint RFP for services to complete a community survey for the City, Family Health West and Communities that Care. The timeline is aggressive to have a report to Council in August (data ready for budget time).
- The Community Center remains busy with 338 paid visitors over 2016 thru April, totaling 62,519 for the year.
- Outdoor pool is scheduled to open May 27 and is currently being prepped for end of school group parties.
- Parks crews are busy, busy, busy!
- We continue to work on the grant requirements and steps to close on purchasing the property next to Little Salt Wash Park.




- May 5 is the Leadercast event hosted by the Fruita Chamber and streamed in to the Fruita Community Center from 9:00 am 3:30 pm.


