Re: WEEKLY INFORMATION UPDATE

City Offices Closed Friday, Nov. 10 in Observance of Veterans Day

#### TID BITS:

- Rim Rock Marathon was a success and much thanks to our partner, the Greater Grand Junction Sports Commission for managing that event.
- A total of 556 runners participated in the Rim Rock Marathon Saturday (up from 435 in 2016): 126 in the marathon, 416 in the half and 14 in the relay. 65% of participants were from out of the area and some came from as far away as the UK and other parts of Europe. Thanks to the Mayor for presenting to award winners.
- Registration is up for the newest event in Fruita, the Kokopelli 140 that will be held Sept. 7-8, 2018. See the website at; <a href="https://www.kokopelli100.com/">https://www.kokopelli100.com/</a>
- We received 4 new residential dwelling units in October. We have received 6 in the first week of November. Full report thru Oct. below.
- The Police Department (PD) is still working with property owners as well as Public Works and Parks on cleanup of homeless camps. The camp on the Chevron property is likely outside of the City limits, but we will still be coordinating the effort.
- PD is confident the Pizza Hut robber is the same person who was responsible for several other robberies throughout the county as well as in Delta. This individual was killed in a shoot-out with police in Parker.
- PD's Colorado Association of Chiefs of Police (CACP) reaccreditation site-visit is scheduled for November 30.
- Public Works (PW) completed some final road patching this week in preparation for winter.
- The contractor completed remaining demolition work and worked on repairing concrete at the Wastewater Reclamation Facility in preparation to install the new headworks screen.
- PW crews completed mountain water records for the 2017 water year, which ended October 31<sup>st</sup>, and have submitted all information to the State Water

Commissioner.

- PW is rotating alternate staff for street sweeping duties to get caught up while our normal operator is on light duty.
- We received updated certification from the State for the elevator at the Civic Center.
- We presented our grant request to DOLA for the Highway 6 Sewer Interceptor on the east side of town.
- Family Health West and Recreation staff began scheduling and planning a 9HealthFair and selected April 28, 2018. The event will be coordinated mostly by FHW and hosted at the Fruita Community Center. This will take the place of the Sweetheart Health Expo, which is typically held in February. The Sweetheart 5K and 10K will occur as planned on Saturday, February 17, 2018.
- The first Youth Communities That Care meeting will take place on Wednesday, November 15 at 6:00 pm at the Fruita Community Center. We hope to recruit some of our area youth to give us insight into the risk and protective factors from their perspective.
- Community Center staff will be getting the word out about the pass rate increases that will take place on January 1, 2018. A letter will be sent out to current FCC pass holders by the week of 11/27, a letter from the P&R Director will be in the upcoming Activity Guide, an article will be in the upcoming City Link and there will be several Facebook posts at the end of November and early December. We will also do a press release near the end of November to let the community know of the changes coming.
- Kokopelli Trail Phase I: road base shouldering continues for the areas already paved. Bridge submittal is approved and should be ordered this week.
- Kokopelli Trail Phase II: Pre-Bid meeting was held yesterday with good attendance. We have most of the big contractors interested in the project.
- Concrete replacement projects throughout the City are nearing completion. Should be wrapped up next week.
- Aspen Alley storm drain installation Storm drain is installed from Pabor to the east-west alley.
   Contractor will begin prep work on north-south alley for concrete drainage pan and finished road base before disturbing and completing storm drain in east-west alley.
- Starbucks plans to start construction no later than Monday of next week now that they picked up their Planning Clearance today. It has Starbucks as the anchor tenant with 2 other units available on the south side of Fruita.






