Tuesday's City Council Workshop

There are two items on the agenda for the workshop on Tuesday, an update on the Fruita Police Department from Chief Krouse and an overview of the lagoon redevelopment studies.

City of Fruita Credit Rating Upgrade (continued)

The City of Fruita received an upgrade in the unenhanced Bond Rating from A+ to AAwith a stable outlook for the 2019 Sales and Use Tax Refunding Bonds from S&P Global Ratings. The ratings reflect S&P's assessment that Fruita has an adequate economy, strong management with good financial policies, strong budgetary performance, very strong budgetary flexibility, very strong liquidity, adequate debt and contingent liability position, and strong institutional framework. Introducing Online Utility Payments (continued)

Coming soon...Fruita residents will have the ability to pay their utility bills online! 24/7 online access will be available to residents with options to pay via credit card, debit card, or eCheck. A convenience fee will apply to online payments. This option will be available through a link from the City's website at www.fruita.org or by visiting www.colorado.gov/payment/cityoffruita. The City will continue to offer the following utility payment options as well: in person at the Fruita Civic Center; by automatic payment – a direct ACH debit from your checking account; your bank's bill payment services; payment drop boxes located on the north side of the Fruita Civic Center and at the Fruita City Market; or by traditional mail. Warning: Dangerous High-Water Conditions (continued)

Highwater levels continue to create potentially dangerous river conditions on the Colorado River and Gunnison River. The Colorado Riverfront Trail remains closed in multiple sections throughout the valley, and in Fruita, is closed at Reed Wash where




