Tuesday's City Council Meeting

The meeting on Tuesday will begin with two proclamations, the first declaring January as Crime Stoppers Month in the City of Fruita, and the second proclaiming January 20, 2020 as Martin Luther King Jr. Day in Fruita. There are a number of items on the consent agenda, and one public hearing continuing the discussion on a potential ballot issue on the lodging tax. The meeting will conclude with an update on Roundabouts projects, and an executive session.

Engineering

• Boring (*the verb not the adjective (*)) operations continue on the Highway 6 Sewer Interceptor project. The contractor has bored under Grand Valley Irrigation Company's Independent Ranchman's Canal and is now heading south under Highway 6 and the Union Pacific Railroad.

Parks and Recreation

- 2019 was a pretty busy year at the Fruita Community Center. We had 184,914 overall visits which is 904 visits above our busiest year ever in 2017. We are still evaluating where those additional visits came from (we are guessing from Silver Sneaker and Silver-n-Fit passes) and the financial impacts this has had to our revenues.
- Christmas lights were turned off on January 1st and the process of taking the lights down will start next week. It's a New Year!


EXPLORE FRUITA WITH THE CITY MANAGER

Dear Fruita Resident:

The City of Fruita and Waste Management of Colorado (WM) entered into a new five-year contract for waste collection and voluntary recycling services for residents effective Jan. 1, 2020.

WM is proud to continue collection services – weekly for trash and every-other-week for recycling – and looks forward to helping to create a clean and green community for 2020 and beyond.

Unlimited Trash Collection Service*

Residents must provide trash carts with this unlimited trash collection service. Please bag trash. Trash must be contained in cart and cannot exceed 32 gallons and 50 pounds per bag/cart. The cost for this service is \$14.15 per month; \$12.20 per month for seniors (age and income eligibility requirements a pply).

 Unlimited waste collection excludes tires, paint and hazardous materials, such as chemicals, automotive fluids and batteries.

Limited 96-Gallon Cart Collection Services Option

Residents may opt to use a 96-gallon cart provided by WM. This is an optional alternative to the unlimited waste services noted above. Effective January 1, 2020, the cost for this service is \$15.40 per month, and the senior rate (age and income eligibility requirements apply) is \$13.25. Voluntary Curb-side Recycling

Residents may opt to participate in every-other-week recycling. WM will provide up to two, 18-gallon bins for residents wishing to participate in recycling. There is no additional charge for this service. Please see recycling guidelines on the 2020 Recycling Calendar.

Winter Weather/Service Delay Notices

Safety isWM's number one priority. WM does its best to service you in a timely fashion, but, in case of dangerous conditions or severe winter weather, you will find service delay notices at www.wm.com/weather-alert/ index.jsp.
