General Updates

- **Bike Ride with the City Manager.** Next Tuesday afternoon, I will be hosting a casual Bike Ride along the Riverfront Trail with Public Works Director Kimberly Bullen. This bike ride is an opportunity for residents to explore Fruita with staff and I and discuss any of the issues on their minds. We will meet at the Fruita Community Center at 4:00 p.m. Hope to see you there!
- **CML Conference.** This week, Councilor Kreie, staff and I attended the Colorado Municipal League Conference. We attended sessions on housing, public communications, leadership, and more.
- **Recover Roadmaps Resiliency Process.** This week I represented our Mesa County Economic Development Partners team with the state on reviewing proposals and presentations from possible consultants to work with the 16 regional teams across the state.

Engineering

- **Fremont Street Design.** A 90% set of drawings is planned for submittal to CDOT by 9/30/2021. A FOR (90%) review meeting has been scheduled with CDOT on September 8, 2021.
- **2021** Concrete Replacements. Another round of concrete replacements went out for quotes with an anticipation of work beginning in the middle of October.
- **Grand Valley Estates 3**. Base course continues to be placed in preparation of installation of curb gutter and sidewalk.
- *Iron Wheel Subdivision.* Concrete for alleys continues. Base course for paving continues to be placed.
- *Pine Street Bridge (at Little Salt Wash).* Working to finalize right of way needs for the beginning of property acquisitions.
- Orchard Ridge Subdivision. Base course is being placed in preparation for paving.
- *Village at country Creek North.* Waterline installation is wrapping up. Storm drain installation will begin next week.

Public Works

- **Stormwater Update.** Mesa County Stormwater Division will be on site September 23rd at the PW Facility to provide training in pollution prevention and good housekeeping training and will conduct the annual audit of the facilities.
- Road Maintenance Update. Road Maintenance staff continues with road patching completing 8
 patches on Columbine and 2 patches on Ottley Ave. Traffic safety is working on replacing street
 signs, crosswalk signs, and stop signs and has begun entering replacement sign data into the GIS
 system. In addition, traffic safety is replacing thermo-plastic markings in the Recreation Center
 parking lot and re-painting parking stalls.
- **Utilities Update.** Utilities crews completed Grand Valley Estates III sewer and storm inspection, Orchard Ridge sewer and storm inspection, installation of new VFD at I-70 lift station and assisted FCC pump out pool for maintenance week. Stan Muhr irrigation water is scheduled to be shut down on 9/24/21 and mountain water shutdown and winterization will be completed.
- **PW Administration Update.** Public Works Director attended CDOT Greenhouse Gas Rulemaking session, worked with the Bureau of Reclamation and other municipalities regarding the Municipal Recreation Agreement and will begin reviewing the GMUG Draft Forest Plan Revision.
