General Updates

- Holiday Traffic Season to Start. Ahead of the holiday, here is an update from the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT). CDOT is remind drivers to expect heavier than normal traffic for the next few days as people travel for Thanksgiving and begin shopping for the holidays. State construction and maintenance projects will be suspended by Wednesday afternoon to help minimize traffic impacts. Due to the possibility of now, motorists heading to the mountains should check road conditions at www.cotrip.org and review weather forecasts before traveling. - **Hwy 6&50 Sewer Update.** Public Works staff met with CDOT and Contractor to discuss Hwy. 6 & 50 sewer line replacement project to discuss alignment, utilities, lane closures, etc.
- Building Maintenance Update. Building Maintenance staff continues with window cleaning at
 the Civic Center. Agape Food Bank has moved out of the Civic Center and staff will work on
 cleaning and painting this space. Staff has completed HVAC repairs at the Civic Center and
 contractor will begin on 11/29/21 making mortar repairs to the building.

- **Congratulations Dave!** We want to congratulate our Fleet Supervisor Dave Wolfe for passing his ASE recertification tests A-4 Steering & Suspension, A-6 Automobile Electronics/Electrical, T-6 Med & Heavy Truck Electronics/Electrical.
- **Road Maintenance Update.** Streets Division crack filled Oakwood, Dean Lee, Darcie Jo, and Maple Streets. Traffic Safety is pricing and ordering way finding signs for city project.
- Collections Update. Wastewater Collections crews took readings for H2S on the Hwy. 6 & 50 sewer project. Staff continue to train on the Vactor truck and monitoring the bypass pump. Staff has scheduled installation of VFD's for the week of the 29th. Staff continues to jet sewer lines and haul grease from I-70 lift station.
- **WWRF Update.** Wastewater Treatment staff completed monthly preventative maintenance around effluent weir cleaning, air ionization cleaning and filter replacement, cleaned and calibrated effluent pH probe and tubing replacement on both influent and effluent samplers. Staff sold approximately 28 yards of bio-solids.
- PW Administrative Update. Public Works Director submitted a Letter of Intent to the Colorado
 Department of Homeland Security Emergency Management for possible grant funding to
 complete design for repairs to Fruita Reservoir #2.
