Highway 340 Roundabouts Project

As you have probably seen, construction is well underway on the improvements to the Highway 340 roundabouts. Once completed, the roundabouts will symbolize and honor the proud history of Fruita. The theme is *Then* and *Now*. The southern roundabout, *Then*, will host a 1½ life-size horse and rider, tractor, and an apple tree surrounded by native vegetation. The northern roundabout, *Now*, will depict our slogan, "Play Like a Local." It will host sculptures, also 1½ life-size, of a cyclist, hiker, and a kayaker nestled amongst natural boulders. This project is the gateway to

Colorado via I-70 and is the first impression for visitors entering Mesa County.

This project has been several years in the making, and the Fruita Arts and Culture Board has been instrumental in moving this project forward and obtaining donations for the artwork to be used. The Arts and Culture Board has commissioned local artist Jeff Bates to create the sculptures, and now that the landscaping is complete, those sculptures have been placed in the roundabouts. Staff is estimating that the remaining art will be completed near the end of summer. All of the

Land Use Code Update and Where to Learn More

For the past year, the City of Fruita has been in the process of updating its Land Use Code and Design Standards for residential and commercial development. These changes are to reflect the vision, goals, and values set forth by the community in the Comprehensive Plan Update, "Fruita in Motion." The Comprehensive Plan update was formally adopted by the Fruita City Council in February 2020. The values and goals identified in "Fruita in Motion" were created as a result of community feedback during the extensive year-long engagement process of 2019. While creating the plan, the City of Fruita hosted over 30 in-person public engagement opportunities in addition

to online opportunities and we appreciate the incredible engagement of residents, businesses and partners.

The Land Use Code updates reflect this public engagement and the community's vision for Fruita for the next decade. This month, the Fruita City Council adopted several significant changes to the Land Use Code focused on zoning uses and general requirements, the official zoning map for the City, density bonuses, design standards, parking standards, and short-term rentals. These amendments to the Land Use Code not only make the Code more consistent with the Community Plan, but also simplify the development process by incorporating

administrative flexibility.

Due to the updates being amended chapter by chapter, more updates are still to come. To view the changes already adopted as well as the proposed changes in the future, residents are encouraged to visit the Planning and Development Department's page on our website at fruita.org/cd. The City is also in the process of finalizing the Parks, Health, Recreation, Open Space and Trails (PHROST) Master Plan, and is in the initial stages of creating the Fruita Circulation and Multi-Modal Transportation Plan. ©

The Public Works Department is an essential part of the City and its core services. The department oversees street maintenance and construction, fleet maintenance, traffic engineering, mountain water rights, wastewater collections and sewer, building maintenance, and mountain water. The department has 25 full-time employees (in addition to seasonal workers) and manages \$6.4 million of the annual budget. ©



Citizen Request Portal Now Available

As we reported in the last City Link, the City of Fruita has launched a new request portal where residents and guests can report issues to staff. Once a work order is submitted, the portal automatically generates a work order tracking number that gets routed to the appropriate department. Citizens can then track the progress of the report and receive a notification when it reaches a resolution. Requests can also be submitted anonymously.

The Citizen Request Portal is not intended for emergency uses, but here are a few examples of what can be submitted through the portal:

- Code Enforcement Issue
- Report a Pothole
- Report a Safety Issue
- Street Light Outages
- Traffic Concerns
- Weed Complaints
