Tuesday's City Council Retreat (Rescheduled from Last Week)

The City Council retreat scheduled for Tuesday, August 2, was rescheduled to Monday, August 8. On Monday, please meet at the Civic Center at 5 pm to carpool to Highline Lake State Park where we will have dinner, engage in team building and have a strategic planning discussion that will help staff come back to Council in future meetings with a draft strategic plan to work through.

2022 Sidewalk Replacement Project

The 2022 Sidewalk Replacement Project is scheduled to begin this Fall and conclude in December of this year. The focus of this year's project will be in the Village at Country Creek and Heritage Meadows subdivisions, with various other, smaller locations around the city. Areas of damaged concrete sidewalk, curb, gutter, and curb ramp will be removed and replaced according to City code. We will work to keep disruption to the public as limited as possible but please be aware that there will be multi-day sidewalk closures throughout these areas while work is being completed. Question: Does the City of Fruita spray for mosquitoes?

Honor the Past – Envision the Future FRUITA

• Answer: No, but the Grand River Mosquito Control District does. The last time they sprayed was on August 2, 2022, from 17 Rd to 19 Rd, north of the highway, and 21 Rd to 24 Rd north of the highway. To help protect the honeybee population and for increased public acceptance, the district only sprays after dark when honeybees have returned to their hives. This is why you might see or hear their fog truck late at night. Police Department

• **National Night Out.** Our officers had a great time visiting with residents in several of our neighborhoods on Tuesday evening during National Night Out. This event is a great opportunity for neighbors to get outside and meet each other and get to know the officers in their community.



Public Works

- **Building Maintenance Update.** Building Maintenance staff rented a manlift and are using it to clean gutters and trim trees at the Chamber of Commerce and the Police Department. They also repaired a swamp cooler for the fleet area of the shop.
- *Fleet Maintenance Update.* Fleet staff repaired sideboards to two dump trucks, repaired a hydraulic leak on our backhoe, and replaced a truck battery. They also performed multiple inspections and services.
- **Road Maintenance Update.** Road Maintenance staff replaced thermal plastic crosswalks and turned arrows on Coulson, patched asphalt on Pinyon Dr. and Pear Dr., and continued with right-of-way mowing.
- **Utilities Update.** The Utilities crew flushed irrigation lines and cleaned headgates and sump pits from silt and mud. They also cleaned out sewer lift station wet wells. We are happy to announce that Troy Melroy accepted the full-time position, as Maintenance Worker II, in the department. Congratulations, Troy!
- Wastewater Treatment Update. Wastewater Treatment staff dealt with an algae issue, that was clogging their non potable water system, and coating the UV systems. They were able to control the issue by draining the wet well, removing the accumulated algae and cleaning UV lamps and modules. They are also staying on top of mowing, trimming and weeding their facility grounds. Replacement of the canvas roof will happen at the end of the month on one of their buildings.
