Bike Park Construction Slated to Begin September 19, 2022 (Continued)

Beginning September 19, 2022, the Fruita Bike Park will be closed to the public for renovations. The trail building team from Singletrack Trails will start the process of updating and adding new features to the park. Given the amount of use, there has been wear to some of the features as well as erosion from weather. To keep the park in a desired condition, reworking some of the elements is required. The project will provide a more durable and longer-lasting set of features and make it more attractive to the users of the bike park. The project is expected to be complete by the end of October. We ask the community to please respect the closure so crews can work safely and efficiently to get the construction done and the bike park back open to the public. We are excited to see this project begin!

#### Weekly FAQ

In every weekly update, we will be answering one question we get asked often from the community. These questions will cover a variety of topics from all city departments. - Question: Is the City planning to renovate Reed Park?
- Answer: Yes! The City of Fruita has been working hard to secure funding for renovations to Reed Park. Designs for the park renovations will begin this fall with construction scheduled for spring of 2023. This past spring, the City of Fruita received funding from PlayCore, GameTime, and Altitude Recreation to design and construct new playgrounds at Reed Park and Prospector Park as well as funding from MUSCO and the US Soccer Foundation for the construction of a MiniPitch at Reed Park. Proposed renovations to Reed Park will include replacing the existing restroom and shelter structure, replacing the playground, electrical upgrades for special events, and installation of a MiniPitch that will include basketball, soccer, and pickleball lines.

#### **General Updates**

- Colorado Outdoor Recreation Industry Office (OREC) Event. On Wednesday, staff attended the listening session for the Colorado Outdoor Recreation Industry Office. The event started with Dr. Perry and Dr. Casey from Colorado Mesa University presenting their recent report on the impact the outdoor recreation industry has on Mesa County's economy. The key takeaway from the report is that Mesa County has a higher GDP (Gross Domestic Product) from outdoor recreation at 4.8% compared to 3.1% statewide. Learn more about the report <u>here</u>. After the presentation, Conor Hall, Director of the Office of Outdoor Recreation, and his team shared current and future grant opportunities for the outdoor recreation industry. The grant opportunities will go towards funding projects that fall into one of the four pillars the office is focusing on which include economic development, conservation and stewardship, education and workforce training, or public health and wellness. As part of the marketing partnership with the Town of Palisade, staff is planning on applying for this grant to create adventure guides for the Grand Valley that can be distributed at local businesses.
- **Center for Children Uplifting Survivor Luncheon**. On Thursday, Mayor Kincaid, myself, staff, and Fruita Police Officers, attended the Center for Children's Uplifting Survivor Luncheon. The Center for Children is the only child abuse victim assistance agency on Colorado's western slope. It was an honor to learn about the impactful work the staff does at the center to help children heal from their tragedies.
- **City Engagement Event Next Week.** Join us at Circle Park next Thursday, September 22<sup>nd</sup> at 1:00 p.m. for casual conversations and a cupcake! These events are a great opportunity to learn about what the City is working on and to ask questions.
- **Discover Fruita Radio Show.** Tune in to KAFM Radio 88.1 next Tuesday, September 20<sup>th</sup> at 12 p.m. for our monthly Discover Fruita radio show. This month, we have Ross Mittelman, Mesa County's Trail Coordinator, and Chris Pipkin, Bureau of Land Management's Outdoor Recreation Planner joining us! We will be discussing the trail expansions happening at the 18 Road Trailhead, the Fruita Trails Initiative, and the North Fruita Desert Master Plan.

• **Blood Drive on Tuesday, October 18.** Sign up to give blood at the Fruita Civic Center on October 18<sup>th</sup>. The drive will be from 1:00 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. but you must schedule an appointment beforehand. <u>Click here</u> to schedule an appointment! - *Highway 340 Trail RFP.* RFPs for the Highway 340 trail design are due next Thursday, September 22, 2022. This design is to connect the Riverfront Trail system from the James M. Robb State Park to Red Cliff Drive on Highway 340.

#### **Public Safety**

• **911 Comm Board Annual Budget Meeting.** The Chief and I attended the annual meeting where the Communications Board for the 911 Communications Center approved the 2023 budget, which includes an increase of \$15,835 for Fruita totaling \$299,920 for 2023.

#### **Public Works**

- **Building Maintenance Update.** Armando Romero attended a Traffic Control Technician course and passed his exam. Congratulations, Armando!
- *Fleet Maintenance Update.* Tires were replaced on several vehicles for multiple departments. Maintenance was performed on two trailers and service on a police vehicle was completed.
- **Road Maintenance Update.** Patches were completed on Amethyst Dr. and Arches Dr. The crew is assisting the Parks division with the demolition of the current Bike Park tracks.
- **Utilities Update.** Staff jetted and cleaned sewer lines in Monument Glenn and Holly Park areas and responded to two irrigation calls. Staff completed testing on lift station alarms and Sensaphones (a phone triggered to call out to the crew supervisor when there is an issue with the lift station). 62 utility locates were completed.
- **Wastewater Treatment Update.** Staff was successful in reducing polymer usage from 8.37 lbs. per ton to 2.1 lbs. per ton resulting in a 75% reduction. Temperature data from the river will be submitted to Tetra Tech to complete the year-long study.
- Admin Update. Public Works Director and staff met to discuss sewer capital projects and possible financing options, attended a webinar on navigating Infrastructure Bill transportation funding, participated in a webinar regarding continuous utility rate management and forecasting, and met with engineering to discuss rights-of-way/easements for the upcoming H2S project.
