Pine Street Bridge Road Closure Begins Next Week

A full road closure of Pine Street north of K.4 Road and south of K.6 Road is scheduled to begin on Monday, October 3, 2022. This road closure will facilitate the utility relocation work during October in support of the Pine Street Bridge Reconstruction Project at the Little Salt Wash bridge crossing. GA Western is scheduled to begin work on the bridge reconstruction on October 31, 2022. The full road closure is expected to last through June of 2023. The City of Fruita Engineering Department requests that all citizens respect the full road closure as hazardous conditions may exist within the construction area and will be intermittent during the utility relocation portion of the project.

Fruita Community Center Maintenance Week (Continued)

The annual maintenance week for the Fruita Community Center will be held from Monday, October 10- Sunday, October 16. In addition, the indoor pool will be closed from October 5 – October 16 for crews to install a new filter system. The full facility (excluding the Fruita Branch of the Mesa County Library) will be closed during this time for maintenance, repairs, and cleaning. If you have questions or need to

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register for an activity, please call our front desk throughout this time. Regular facility hours will resume Monday, October 17.

Public Works

 Irrigation Update. Crews will begin shutting down City supplied irrigation water the week of October 17th. If you belong to an HOA, please contact your HOA for their scheduled shut-off date.

- **Building Maintenance Update.** The Public Works and Parks shop passed the fire inspection.
- *Fleet Maintenance Update.* Emergency equipment was installed on a police vehicle. DOT inspection, preventative maintenance service, and tires were replaced on a Public Works dump truck.
- **Road Maintenance Update.** Potholes were filled in on 15.5 Rd. and the road was bladed. The crew prepped for a control burn on October 4 at the Wastewater Treatment Facility off of 15 Rd. New Public Parking signs were installed downtown.
- **Utilities Update.** Grease was hauled from the I-70 lift station. Alarm testing at all lift stations was performed. Orchard Ridge sewer lines were jetted and inspected by the CCTV camera. 31 utility locates were performed.
- *Wastewater Treatment Update.* With the power adjustment fees increasing their energy bill, the superintendent is working on energy savings by rotating equipment.
- **Admin Update.** Staff met with the Planning Department and Engineering Department to discuss possible alternatives for the H2S Project. The Public Works Director attended the GVRTC meeting with Councilor Kreie and participated in the virtual meeting with the stakeholder group regarding Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) update.
