City of Fruita Awarded \$650,000 Grant for Aeration Project at the Wastewater Reclamation Facility

On Thursday, the City of Fruita was notified by the Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) of a grant award for \$650,000 to assist in the Fruita Wastewater Reclamation Aeration System Project. The grant is from the Energy Impact Assistance program from DOLA.

North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza Update (Continued)

Bids for the construction of the North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza closed Friday, December 9, 2022, and Professional Pipeline and Concrete, Inc. was awarded the contract. The total project cost is within the budget at \$449,925. This includes construction/installation of the hardscape improvements for \$335,315 (drainage, gas lines, electricity, irrigation lines, planters, parking spaces, brick base, etc.) and \$70,000 for contingencies and amenities (seating, fire pits, etc.). The cost of the purchase of the shade sails is \$44, 610 (installation is part of the \$335,315). Artwork will be covered by the Arts & Culture Board art program, and we will seek opportunities for amenities from local artisans that will have an artistic functional use. Mobilization is planned to begin the week of January 2, 2023, and construction is anticipated to last until late April/early May of 2023. Mulberry Street Plaza Items for Sale

With the North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza project beginning, crews have disassembled the tents and yurt and will be listing those items for sale on Govdeals. Anyone can bid on these items; you will just need to create an account ahead of time. The website for bidding is GovDeals.com. After getting to the website, click on "Buyer Registration" in the upper right-hand corner of the page. Fill in all required fields and click on "I agree to the terms and conditions" at the bottom of the page.

Once you have registered, you will receive confirmation/verification emails. One of those emails will instruct you to follow a link and upload a copy of a utility bill of some sort, so they can verify your address. It could take up to 24 hours after registering as a buyer before you receive that email. Once you've submitted your verification document, it can take up to another 24 hours for GovDeals to verify all your information. Once the verification process is complete, you should have full access to start bidding. GovDeals does make everyone go through a probationary period and limits the amount of bidding an individual can perform. The account probation is outlined at GovDeals.com.

Update on Fruita Community Center Gym Floor Replacement

Removal of the damaged floor started on Wednesday, December 21. During the replacement, the gym floor on the first level of the Fruita Community Center will be closed as well as the indoor track on the second floor. The track will be closed in order to place a barrier on the second floor to keep dust and debris away from the fitness equipment. At this time, there is not a confirmed timeline for replacement, but we will share an expected opening date as soon as possible. Fruita City Council Adopts 2023 Municipal Budget (Continued)

On December 6, 2022, the Fruita City Council adopted the 2023 Municipal Budget including \$27.3 million in projected revenues (excluding transfers from other funds and other financing sources), and \$30 million in proposed expenditures between all funds. The City of Fruita's annual budget mirrors the priorities outlined in the Fruita Strategic Plan while also providing essential core services and aligning with the City's core values. The City's Strategic Plan identifies specific goals and projects to improve the quality of life and place for Fruita residents for the next several years.

The planning documents that guide Fruita City Council and staff's decision-making for each budget year is the reflection of an extensive amount of community input from Fruita residents. - Question: What is the single-use bag fee, and does it only apply to Fruita businesses?
- Answer: Starting January 1, 2023, a single-use bag fee of \$0.10 per bag will be imposed. This is a Colorado State Law affecting all communities in Colorado. General Updates

- December Workshop Canceled. As a reminder, there is no City Council workshop scheduled for this month.
- **Discover Fruita Radio Show**. Another episode of Fruita's radio/podcast aired on KAFM radio this past Tuesday. Public Works Director Kimberly Bullen and Streets Supervisor Tom Nankervis talked about snow removal and upcoming projects in the department. - Mesa County Economic Update. Dr. Nathan Perry from Colorado Mesa University released the
 fourth quarter 2022 Mesa County Economic Report. Highlights from the report include an
 increase in GDP by 3.74% compared to 2020, an increase in personal income from \$48,884 to
 \$52,121 per year, and inflation is at 7.1% which is lower than the forecast of 7.3%. View the full

Engineering

- Broadband Project Update. Staff is in the process of finalizing the Requests for Proposals for the
 design/build of our middle-mile broadband project. The RFP has been provided to our regional
 partners for review, and once completed, we will administer the bid process early next year.
 Staff anticipated that a contract will be awarded shortly after that, with construction to occur in
 2023.
- *Pine Street Bridge.* Colorado Piling Service installed the piles for the north abutment of the new bridge. GA Western set the large blocks in place for Retaining Wall 2. Rebar and forms were built, and the concrete was placed for the concrete cap over Retaining Wall 2. GA Western began preparation for the sanitary sewer relocation by welding the steel casing pipe for installation across the Little Salt Wash. The job site was secured, and construction was suspended for the Holiday Season. Construction will resume on Tuesday January 3, 2023.

Parks and Recreation

- Fruita Community Center Closures. The Fruita Community Center will close at noon on December 24 and will be fully closed on December 25. There will be no fitness or water aerobics classes on December 26.
- Start your new year fitness journey with the Biggest Change Challenge. By participating in this program, you will receive workouts, meal plans, weekly challenges, trainer and nutritionist support and more. The program runs from January 9-February 19 for adults 18+. Registration is required by January 7 and has a fee of \$123.
- **Cookies & Claus was a success!** We had over 120 kids in the gym to visit Santa, enjoy cookies and cocoa, write letters to Santa, and listen to stories from a librarian. We had over 100 letters written to Santa at the event and lots of smiling faces throughout the evening.
