Tuesday's City Council Meeting

Tuesday's meeting will begin with one proclamation for adopting January 2023 as "Crime Stoppers" month in the City of Fruita. We will then move on to the administrative agenda with an update on the Building Division and Public Safety. We will then end the night with City Council reports and actions and an executive session for the City Manager's formal review. See you on Tuesday!

North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza Update (Continued)

Bids for the construction of the North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza closed Friday, December 9, 2022, and Professional Pipeline and Concrete, Inc. was awarded the contract. The total project cost is within the budget at \$449,925. This includes construction/installation of the hardscape improvements for \$335,315 (drainage, gas lines, electricity, irrigation lines, planters, parking spaces, brick base, etc.) and \$70,000 for contingencies and amenities (seating, fire pits, etc.). The cost of the purchase of the shade sails is \$44, 610 (installation is part of the \$335,315). Artwork will be covered by the Arts & Culture Board art program, and we will seek opportunities for amenities from local artisans that will have an artistic functional use. Mobilization is planned to begin the week of January 2, 2023, and construction is anticipated to last until late April/early May of 2023. Mulberry Street Plaza Items for Sale (Continued)

With the North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza project beginning, crews have disassembled the tents and yurt and will be listing those items for sale on Govdeals. Anyone can bid on these items; you will just need to create an account ahead of time. The website for bidding is GovDeals.com. After getting to the website, click on "Buyer Registration" in the upper right-hand corner of the page. Fill in all required fields and click on "I agree to the terms and conditions" at the bottom of the page.

Once you have registered, you will receive confirmation/verification emails. One of those emails will instruct you to follow a link and upload a copy of a utility bill of some sort, so they can verify your address. It could take up to 24 hours after registering as a buyer before you receive that email. Once you've submitted your verification document, it can take up to another 24 hours for GovDeals to verify all your information. Once the verification process is complete, you should have full access to start bidding. GovDeals does make everyone go through a probationary period and limits the amount of bidding an individual can perform. The account probation is outlined at GovDeals.com.




- Question: Where can I learn more about current city construction projects?
- **Answer:** By visiting <u>fruita.org/projects</u>, you will find a list and map of current city construction projects. The map displays where in Fruita the construction is taking place and by clicking on the

project title, you can view more information about the construction such as timelines, when construction began, and updates along the way.

General Updates

- January Business After Hours. The City of Fruita will be hosting the Chamber Business After Hours next month on January 12, 2023, at 5:30 p.m. at the Fruita Community Center. We hope you can join us!
- End of Year Communication Data. Each month, we track how well our various communication channels are performing, including social media and the fruita.org website. Since April, the City of Fruita's Facebook page has grown by 17% in page followers and has an average monthly reach of 10,759 people. Also in April, the City of Fruita started a new Instagram account. The account has grown by about 318 followers and has seen an average monthly reach of 1,881 people. The City of Fruita began utilizing the Nextdoor social media platform and sees an average of 4,964 impressions per month. Since July, fruita.org has seen 10,487 monthly users. Parks and Recreation

- Basketball Court Update. The basketball courts received significant water damage earlier this month. On Thursday, December 22, contractors removed the entire wood floor area. The concrete floor is now drying out and the installation will begin in January, with a date to be determined. The running track is currently open since construction won't be starting until January. The usage of the track is subject to change at any time for construction needs and safety.
- Fruita Community Center Facility Hours. On Saturday, December 31, the full facility will close at 5:00 pm. The facility will be fully closed on Sunday, January 1. There will be no fitness or water aerobics classes on January 1 or 2.
- *Fruita Community Center Visits.* December visits through Dec 27, 2022, are at 10,422. We project to end the year with about 174,500 visits for the entire year.
- Start your new year fitness journey with the Biggest Change Challenge. By participating in this program, you will receive workouts, meal plans, weekly challenges, trainer and nutritionist support and more. The program runs from January 9-February 19 for adults 18+. Registration is required by January 7 and has a fee of \$123.

- **Future Cats Basketball Camp new location.** Future Cats Basketball camp for ages 6-13 will be offered on January 3-5. This camp has a new location at Redlands Middle School. Register and learn more at fruita.activityreg.com.
- New Session of Teen Weightlifting Starting Soon! Teens aged 14-17 can learn proper form and strength training in these Sunday session classes. The next session will start on January 8th at 9:30 am - 11:00 am with a fee of \$40 for the full session.
