Tuesday's City Council Meeting

Tuesday night will begin with a presentation recognizing the Public Works Employees who completed the 2023 Public Works Supervisor Training Program, followed by two public hearings for a liquor license change and the second reading for ordinance 2023-14. After public hearings, there's one item on the administrative agenda for an overview of the Pavement Assessment Project. The meeting will end with Council reports and actions where the City Council will adjourn and convene as the Fruita Housing Authority to consider recommending a 2024 budget for the Housing Authority then reconvening at the Fruita City Council for an executive session. Reed Park Redesign Underway

The community can expect to see construction begin at Reed Park in the next couple of weeks. The park is fenced off, and access to the basketball court, horseshoe pits, shelter, restrooms, playground, and south parking lot are closed. The grass area is available for public use. The fenced area will remain closed to the public until the project is completed in June 2024. Crews will begin work on renovations to the bathroom facilities first. We will have more information and timelines on the renovation next week and will share them in the weekly update, on the project page, and on social media.

Fruita Leaf Pick Up Program – ONE MORE WEEK

There is one week left in the leaf pick up program! Fruita residents can place bagged leaves next to their trash can on their regular trash service day. Waste Management will dispose of bagged leaves in addition to regular trash service during these three weeks throughout the fall season. Please bag leaves in a plastic trash bag. Waste Management will only pick up bags of leaves.

 as timelines, when construction began, and updates along the way.

General Updates

- Fruita Building Code Trainings. On Thursday and Friday, the Fruita Community Development
 Department hosted the first Fruita Building Code Training. Two classes were offered to the
 development community, CMU students, and employees. The classes were taught by
 professionals in the building industry, and attendees had the opportunity to obtain continued
 education credit.
- Annual Department Budget Meetings. This week, I had the opportunity to meet with each department to present the 2024 budget and review our core values and the Strategic Plan.
- *Update on 2024 Budget.* With the recent state legislation dealing with property taxes for next year, the City of Fruita has postponed the proposed adoption of the 2024 Budget to the second

- meeting of this month, December 19th. The reason for continuing the public hearing to that date (as opposed to the normal time, the first meeting in December) was to receive updated property tax information for Fruita from the Mesa County Assessor. With the new law that was approved, organizations have until January 10, 2024, to adopt budgets for the upcoming year.
- **2024 Fruita Academy.** The next Fruita Academy is scheduled to take place from April 11 May 2, 2024. This class will be held in the evening from 5:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. This will be our second time hosting the Fruita Academy, which provides interested community members the opportunity to learn in-person about Fruita's local government, tour facilities, and spend time with local leaders. Registration is free and available online at fruita.org/academy.
- All Kids Bike Event. On Wednesday, Shelledy Elementary School invited Mayor Kincaid and the Fruita School Resource Officers to join in celebrating the donation of 24 new strider bikes! Thank you for the invite and congratulations! We can't wait to see so many kiddos learn how to ride bikes in P.E. class.



Engineering

- *Maple Street Bridge.* The design of the Maple Street Bridge has been awarded to SGM with contracts under negotiation.
- Rose Creek Subdivision. Anticipate the beginning of construction for Rose Creek Subdivision
 beginning in the coming weeks. This will affect Ottley Ave between Brandon Estates and 19
 Road.

- **Greenway Drive.** A preconstruction meeting was held for the Fruita RV Resort Project to get the roadway improvements completed for Greenway Drive.
- Copper Creek West Subdivision. Sewer line installation within the subdivision continues to progress.

Parks and Recreation

- **Fitness Equipment TV's.** Staff at the FCC are closer to rectifying the issues that have prevented continuous service on the treadmill TVs as well as the wall TVs. Charter Spectrum was able to reset the connection, which will temporarily provide the necessary frequency for cable access. The current equipment is obsolete and will not work with the major video upgrade Charter is implementing in our region. Further investigation into this situation has generated discussion about a fiber connection into the facility to aid in permanently resolving this issue.
- Holiday Craft Fair. On Saturday, December 9 from 10:00 am − 3:00 pm the Fruita Community Center will host the annual holiday craft fair. A total of 113 applicants submitted with a total of 64 vendors approved to participate. Items to be sold include a wide variety of handmade goods including jewelry, soap, candles, wall art, glasswork, clothing, and much more. The fitness areas, pool, and library will maintain regular operational hours, however, please note the traffic will be heavy and the parking lot is predicted to be full most of the day. Overflow parking is offered on the street and at Shelledy Elementary School. Admission to the fair is FREE.
- The first-annual Gingerbread House Contest. The FCC is hosting a Gingerbread House contest this season for any youth designer ages 4 16! Creations may be dropped off at the FCC starting December 1 through December 12. All contestants must complete the entry form available at the front desk. The public is encouraged to view and vote on their favorite structure. Prizes will be awarded to "Best in Show" and "Most Creative Design". Winners will be notified on December 22, 2023.
