- Recycle for a FEE: Computer Monitors \$12, Desktop Printers/Copiers \$5, Flat Screen/CRTs (measured diagonally) Up to 27" \$1 per inch, Over 27" \$2 per inch, All Other Electronics \$5

## **General Updates**

- Walk to See Fruita. Next Thursday, we are hosting our monthly engagement series. This month, residents can enjoy a walk around downtown Fruita while asking questions and learning about what's new in the city! We will meet at the Mulberry Plaza at 9 am.
- **Mesa Talks**. Join Mesa County on Tuesday, October 10 to learn about Mesa County Behavioral Health's comprehensive report. The day will also include speakers on mental health and substance abuse. Learn more on Mesa County's website.
- Localism Committee. The application for the Localism Committee is now available online. This committee will review the possible creation of a new City Board, the "Localism" Board. The committee will identify how a localism board would operate, including goals and priorities. Learn more at fruita.org/bc.
- Enoch's Lake Real Estate Listing. Enoch's Lake was listed on the real estate market this week and will be on the market until November 8, 2023. You can view the listing online. After the listing ends, Fruita City Council will review all offers submitted during a City Council meeting scheduled for Monday, November 13, 2023. After reviewing the offers, the Fruita City Council can decide to move an offer forward to the next steps, which include Ute Water's first right of refusal and the City's ordinance process with two public hearings.

## Engineering

- **Reed Park Improvements.** A pre-bid meeting was held on Friday, October 6. Next Friday at 1:30 p.m., city staff will open bids for the project.
- *Kismet Minor Subdivision Construction.* CW Construction began work on the Kismet Subdivision this week. Mesa Street was closed to through traffic north of the Ottley Avenue intersection to allow the extension of the sanitary sewer main. Ute Water is scheduled to complete the live taps to the existing water main in Mesa Street next week, allowing continuous service to the existing residents on that main (barring unforeseen difficulties.) Mesa Street will remain closed to through traffic until the work for the water services is complete, and the trenches are backfilled. Mesa Street will close in the future for asphalt patching.



## **Parks and Recreation**

- **Monthly Newsletter.** The <u>Parks and Recreation monthly newsletter is now available</u>. Learn about new programming happening right here in Fruita!
- Waterslide Update. The contractor and engineer met on site last week to finalize a plan for the water slide at the FCC. The final drawings should be completed by the end of the month. The project is anticipated to start in early 2024.
- Locker Room Re-Tile Project. FCC maintenance staff have been meeting with contractors throughout the week to finalize their response to our RFP for the re-tile project. The Men's and Women's locker rooms as well as the family restrooms will be getting new tile.
- Youth art and youth dance started this week. Youth art started this week with our new art instructor Carlee Warden. Youth Dance also started on Tuesday night and our PreK class is full.
- Aquatics lessons and programs. We have nearly 45 kids signed up for our Tuesday/Thursday swim lessons, and 6 kids signed up for our youth diving program. Special Olympics started up again this week as well!
- **Parks Winterization has begun**. Parks crews will begin the winterization process in our parks in anticipation of colder temperatures.

## **Police Department**

• Calls for Service Statistics. In September 2023, the Grand Junction Regional Communications Center logged 858 calls for service for the Fruita Police Department. This compares with 682 calls for service in September 2022, showing a 26% increase. Year to date, we are at 8,306 calls for service in 2023 compared with 6,294 this time last year, showing a 32% increase. It should be noted that the majority of that increase results from a change in the way we are tracking officer-initiated activities.

## **Public Works**

- **H2S Mitigation and Aeration Project.** The H2S Mitigation Project and Aeration Project continue to make good progress. The contractor is expected to install the final manhole on Saturday morning, which is ahead of schedule. Next week, the installation of the rebuilt and new bearing assembly for the mixers in the oxidation ditch will occur.
- Thermal Crosswalks. Road Maintenance crew is installing thermal crosswalks on chip sealed roads.
- *Irrigation Update.* Irrigation is expected to be shut off either the week of October 16<sup>th</sup> or October 23<sup>rd</sup>, depending on the weather.
