General Updates

- WaterSmart Conference. Councilor Miller, staff, and I attended the three-day Growing WaterSmart Workshop to identify and then create an action plan for the City of Fruita to work towards. Our team had representation from Ute Water and the Mesa Conservation District which helped us plan for future collaboration between all of our agencies. This workshop was extremely helpful for us to identify specific goals to work towards when it comes to water consumption and quality in Fruita.
- **MCCOA Retreat.** On Friday, the marketing and communications team attended the annual Mesa County Communications Officer Association (MCCOA) retreat. Communications and

Engagement Specialist Ciara DePinto, has been part of this group for many years and has found the group extremely helpful when coordinating with other agencies on communication efforts. The retreat had an array of speakers, including topics on digital marketing, podcasting, finding your personality style, and a panel discussion.

- *Mesa County Economic Update*. Dr. Nathan Perry with Colorado Mesa University publishes a quarterly economic report for Mesa County. - **Cups for a Cure Postponed to Next Week.** Due to inclement weather conditions, the Fruita Chamber decided to postpone Cups for a Cure event to next Saturday, November 4, 2023 from 1:00 p.m. 4:00 p.m. in the Fruita Civic Center.

- *Kismet Minor Subdivision.* The concrete sidewalk along the east side of Mesa Street for this subdivision was completed this week. Xcel completed the necessary permanent repairs to a gas main that was damaged during construction of the sanitary sewer main. The asphalt cut that Xcel had to make in the road is scheduled for repair on Friday October 27, 2023.
- **Reed Park Bid Opening.** Last Friday afternoon, staff held a bid opening for construction of the Reed Park renovations. The low bidder was Ford Construction at \$2.16 million. Staff is evaluating both bids and will provide an update to Council at the next meeting.

- *Fleet Maintenance Update. Fleet* Services prepared winter maintenance equipment ahead of the expected storm moving through the area.
- **Update on Wastewater Reclamation Facility Projects.** The H2S Mitigation project and Aeration project at the Wastewater Treatment Facility continues to move closer to completion. The Biofilter pad is to be poured Monday Oct 30, delivery date of Biofilter is expected Oct 30th with tentative startup for biofilter the week of November 17th. Aeration grids for basin 2 are nearly finished (1-2) days with startup scheduled for week of Nov. 17th for basin 2.
- **Training.** Public Works crews participated in the Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping Training provided by Mesa County Stormwater Coordinator. Staff also completed the annual facility inspection.
