Re: WEEKLY INFORMATION UPDATE

Tuesday's City Council Special Meeting (6:00 p.m.) and Regular Workshop (6:30 p.m.)

As a reminder, we have two meetings scheduled for Tuesday night. We have a special meeting scheduled at 6:00 p.m. for the purposes of an Executive Session to discuss the purchase of property and receive legal advice from the City Attorney. Following the special meeting, we will go into our normal workshop meeting. On the agenda for the workshop is four items – the first is to continue the discussion on the Fruita Tourism Advisory Council following their presentation earlier this month. After that, the Council will hear from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board (PRAB) on their purpose, past accomplishments, and goals for the upcoming year. Following the two Board and Commission items, we will discuss the process for the Charter Review and the TABOR process for next year. See you all on Tuesday night!

I-70 Westbound: Right Lane Closed due to Flooding.

Right lane of I-70 just west of Fruita going westbound is closed to one lane due to flooding. The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) will be monitoring road conditions in this area throughout the weekend. Fiber Construction Update

Next Week (Week of May 22, 2023), Clearnetworx/Deeply Digital, an internet service provider, will continue construction in Fruita in the Legacy Subdivision and along Pine Street. For questions and comments on fiber internet, please call Clearnetworx/Deeply Digital at 970-240-6600.

The City of Fruita has been working with several companies interested in installing fiber internet in the community. Residents will begin to see work being done throughout the city over the next few months. Residents will start to see Clearnetworx/Deeply Digital laying fiber cables under concrete and multipurpose easements in various neighborhoods. Fruita residents can expect to see notifications with signage, door hangers, and mailers from the fiber internet companies. The City of Fruita will also be sharing information weekly on areas where fiber crews will be working. Fiber construction updates from the City of Fruita will be available through the City of Fruita's various communication channels including updates at Fruita.org/fiberinternet, Nextdoor, and the Friday Weekly Update. ArborWorks Schedule for Next Week

Xcel Energy, working with AborWorks, a utility line clearance company, began trimming trees in Fruita in mid-February. They will be trimming all trees, both private and public, if the tree is a hazard for powerlines. The team will continue tree trimming services in Fruita next week. Below you can find area maps of where the team will be working.

Weekly FAQ

In every weekly update, we will be answering one question we get asked often from the community. These questions will cover a variety of topics from all city departments. If you have any questions, you think would be valuable for us to share, let us know by emailing communications@fruita.org.

- Question: What is broadband internet?
- Answer: The City of Fruita, working with Region 10, a non-profit that works on broadband projects on Colorado's Western Slope, is installing fiberoptic cables from Grand Junction to Fruita to bring Giga bite internet speeds to Fruita residents. The City of Fruita is currently waiting for the construction contract to be finalized. Once this connection, called the Middle Mile, is complete, more internet providers can come to Fruita. Residents will start to see construction over the next several months throughout neighborhoods from internet service providers who have started their portion of construction for fiber internet connections.

General Updates

- Congratulations Graduates! Congratulations to all the Fruita Monument Seniors that graduated on Tuesday night!
- March 2023 Financial Reports. The financial reports for March 2023 will be included in the City
 Council packet for the first meeting in June. The reports were delayed slightly this month due to
 receiving some of the information later than the deadline for the second meeting this month.
 Highlights of the report include:

- City Sales Tax When compared to the prior March, City sales tax collections increased
 14% and is trending at an increase of 14% overall.
- Use Tax on Motor Vehicles Use taxes collected on motor vehicles were down less than
 1% in March but is still at 10% increase year-to-date.
- Use Tax on Building Materials Were down 83% in March 2023, trending at a decrease of 22% overall.
- City Lodging Tax The 3% lodging tax was down 17% in March 2023, trending at a decrease of 3%.
- County Sales Tax Was up less than 1% in March, year to date is at an increase of 1%.
- **State of the Valley Next Wednesday.** Mayor Kincaid and I will be speaking at the State of the Valley, hosted by the Grand Junction Chamber of Commerce, next Wednesday afternoon. More information is available on their website.
- *Mesa County State of the County Video*. Last week, Mesa County released the 2023 State of the County video. Topics of the video include the recent community health survey, the treatment of the Japanese beetle, county-wide broadband efforts, and more. The video can be found online.
- **Summer City Link.** The 2023 Summer City Link was sent to the printer last week and should be arriving at homes next week. You can also view the City Link online.
- **Engagement Event Recap.** This morning, City Engineer Sam Atkins and I hosted a Coffee with the City Manager and staff at Bestslope Coffee to discuss current and future projects that the City is working on. We discussed many of the transportation projects included in our Strategic Plan like the Pine Street Bridge project and broadband project. Thank you to everyone that joined us this morning for the discussion!

Engineering


• **Pine Street Bridge Update.** Ben Dowd Construction, the pipe subcontractor, completed the installation and testing of the Ute Water Main that crosses the bridge. The project has entered the utility reinstallation phase and multiple crews will be mobilizing and working on their respective portions of the project. The Engineering Department would like to remind the public that the bridge remains closed to all modes of transportation including vehicular, bicycles and pedestrians. Public safety is a primary concern and hazardous conditions remain and will continue to change in location and severity in the construction zone.



- **TEDS.** Engineering staff participated in a meeting to update the City of Grand Junction's Transportation Engineering Design Standards Manual. It is slated to go out for public review shortly with adoption in the fall.
- **2023 Street Striping.** The annual street striping bid opening was this Friday afternoon. Bids will be evaluated for completeness and a recommendation of award will be made next week.
- City Engagement Event. Engineering department staff participated in the (Quality of Place) City Engagement Event with the City Manager and Communications Specialist at Bestslope Coffee Company Friday morning.

Parks and Recreation

- Our final 2022/2023 school year Night at the FCC had 245 kids in attendance! It was great to have our youth back in the facility celebrating the end of the school year with basketball, bump n jumps, swimming, dance and more. We wish all our students a great summer!
- FCC pool community use. The FCC pool has been used for many unique community programs this month. We have had the FMHS physics class testing their cardboard boats, elementary school swim days, and a robot test as well. Our school swims will have served over 500 local kids! These programs have kept our staff busy, and we want to thank them for all their hard work!






