General Updates

• **2023 Ride Magazine.** The Daily Sentinel's recent Ride Magazine publication highlights the efforts of the biking community here in Fruita. The magazine shares upcoming biking events such as 18 Hours of Fruita, Adventure Fest, Co2uT, and the Fruita Fat Tire Festival. The publication also showcases the trail building efforts happening at 18 Road and the Kokopelli Trailhead as well as various maps of the 18 Road Trail system and wayfinding routes in Fruita. Administration

• Job Openings. The City of Fruita continues to recruit for a variety of positions. New this week is that the Fruita Community Center is accepting applications for a Facility Manager. In addition to that, we are also accepting applications for full-time positions in Public Works, and part-time positions in Parks and Recreation. Engineering

- *Pine Street Bridge Update.* Work continued on the bridge deck and top portion of the abutments. The permanent steel deck forms that span the area between the concrete girders were completely installed with all gaps between the steel decking and temporary forms for the abutments being closed. Supply chain issues and materials availability have affected the project schedule and the anticipated date for the bridge deck concrete placement has been delayed to March 22, 2023. This delay affects the construction of the permanent irrigation main across the bridge, which will not be completed by the time irrigation water begins flowing in April. The contract provided contingencies for this situation and GA Western will place a temporary bridge to support a temporary irrigation main across the Little Salt Wash.
- **N. Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza Project Update.** This week more shade sail and light post foundations were installed along with some decorative concrete along the new parking spots on the south end of the project. More decorative concrete installation is slated for early next week, depending on weather conditions.
- **Fruita Civic Center Construction Update.** The two-room remodel of the spaces north and south of the Administrative Office is progressing. Floor joists have been installed in both rooms to raise the existing floor to match the main floor level and openings have been cut into the masonry walls for access to these rooms from the current Administrative Office. The current schedule has completion slated for the end of May.



Parks and Recreation

- Fruita Community Center Visit Numbers. During the month of February, we had 13,800 visits to the Fruita Community Center (FCC). The busiest day was President's Day with a total of 725 check ins.
- **6,050 visits away from our 2 millionth Visitor!** We anticipate giving away a 12 month pass to an individual in the middle of March to celebrate this achievement.
- Update on the Gym Floor Installation at the Fruita Community Center. The flooring has its first two coats of sealer complete. The basketball courts are now in the process of getting the court lines completed. This will include the City of Fruita's F Gear logo at center court and new line colors for better visibility. The timeline for completion and opening of our basketball court is early March.
- **The Aquatics boiler has been repaired.** The Heat relay motherboard on the boiler for the FCC pools has been replaced and our indoor pool is back up to 86 degrees.
- Night at the FCC March 3 cancelled. This date was cancelled to allow for the completion of the basketball court flooring. The next night at the FCC is May 12, 2023. This event is for 5th-7th graders to enjoy the Fruita Community Center all to themselves. Entry is \$10 per student and parent sign in/out required.

Police Department

- Calls for Service Statistics. In February 2023, the Grand Junction Regional Communications Center logged 791 calls for service for the Fruita Police Department. This compares with 546 calls for service in February 2022, showing a 45% increase. Year to date, Fruita Police Department has logged 1,805 calls for service compared to this time last year, a 59% increase. It should be noted that the majority of that increase results from a change in the way we are tracking officer-initiated activities.
- **POST Board.** Chief Krouse received an appointment from the Governor to serve a two-year term on the Colorado Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) board.

Public Works

- **Congratulations Troy!** Congratulations to Troy Melroy for passing his Wastewater Collections II exam!
- **Sewer Funds Meeting.** City Staff met with Waterworth the vendor for the city that provides software to do continuous analysis of our Sewer Fund. The program allows staff to build scenarios to take into account capital improvements, debt service, operations and maintenance and revenue forecasting to determine cash flow and evaluate sewer rates.
- **Grand Valley Regional Transporation Committee.** Public Works Director, Kimberly Bullen, participated in the Grand Valley Regional Transportation Committee meeting on behalf of Councilor Kreie.

- **Public Works Meetings.** Public Works Director, Kimberly Bullen, attended multiple meetings this week to better support Fruita Public Works. She attended the Mesa Conservation District meeting to discuss watershed planning, attended a webinar on trenchless designs and risk mitigation, met with City of Fruita's Attorney, Mesa County Attorney, and Mesa County Regulatory Programs Manager to discuss Wetlands Banking, and participated in the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment Water Quality Roadmap quarterly meeting.
- **Grand Valley Public Works.** Public Works staff attended a meeting with Grand Valley Public Works organizations to discuss a number of topics related to Public Works. Agenda items include snow response 2022-23, street maintenance including pavement assessments, overlay coordination, chip seal coordination, crackfill/pothole repairs, CIP Coordination.
- *City Shops.* Shoutout to all of our Public Works Staff for always keeping workspaces clean, organized, and taking care of equipment. Thank you!
