# North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza Update – Week of January 6

Construction for the North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza was originally scheduled to begin this week. However, due to weather and delays in materials being delivered, the contractor anticipates starting the underground work around January 15. You may see construction fencing and more signage in the project area next week.

# Fruita Civic Center Construction

Construction for the expansion of office space on the first floor of the Fruita Civic Center is slated to begin in the next couple of weeks. You may see fencing and signage start to go up around the building next week. The construction project will be adding seven offices and shared workspace for City staff in the Administration and Community Development Departments.

# Mulberry Street Plaza Items for Sale (Continued)

With the North Mulberry Street Outdoor Plaza project beginning, crews have disassembled the tents and yurt and will be listing those items for sale on Govdeals. Anyone can bid on these items; you will just need to create an account ahead of time. The website for bidding is <u>GovDeals.com</u>. After getting to the website, click on "Buyer Registration" in the upper right-hand corner of the page. Fill in all required fields and click on "I agree to the terms and conditions" at the bottom of the page. Once you have registered, you will receive confirmation/verification emails. One of those emails will instruct you to follow a link and upload a copy of a utility bill of some sort, so they can verify your address. It could take up to 24 hours after registering as a buyer before you receive that email. Once you've submitted your verification document, it can take up to another 24 hours for GovDeals to verify all

your information. Once the verification process is complete, you should have full access to start bidding. GovDeals does make everyone go through a probationary period and limits the amount of bidding an individual can perform. The account probation is outlined at GovDeals.com.

• **Pine Street Bridge Update.** Construction activities were resumed on January 3, 2023, after the Holiday work suspension. GA Western backfilled Retaining Wall 2 and prepared the site for driving the piles on the south side of the Little Salt Wash. Riprap was delivered to the site and placement along the south bank of the Little Salt Wash was started. Colorado Piling Service installed the piles for the south abutment of the new bridge.

## **Police Department**

- **Staffing Update.** Officer Logan Hunt has left the department after five years of dedicated service to pursue opportunities in another industry. We wish Logan all the best. We currently have two active police officer vacancies.
- **Calls for Service Statistics.** In December 2022 the police department answered 697 calls for service compared with 541 in December 2021 accounting for a 29% increase. Year to date in 2023 we have responded to 8,695 calls for service compared with 8,478 in 2021, equaling a 3% increase.

#### **Public Works**

- **Fruita Mountain Water Properties**. City staff met with representatives from Jones & DeMille Engineering for a kick-off meeting to begin the Preliminary Investigative Feasibility Study for the city's Mountain Water properties. This project is funded by the NRCS through a grant program.
