WASTE MANAGEMENT TRASH COLLECTION CHANGES TO CURBSIDE PICKUP BEGINNING IN 2024

Last year, Waste Management (WM) transitioned a handful of Fruita neighborhoods to an automatic collection system utilizing 96-gallon carts. This change improves safety for Waste Management personnel, helps improve cleanliness in Fruita, and reduces litter in the environment. Starting in January 2024, all Fruita households will be transitioned to the automated collection system.

We realize this change in service will be an adjustment for residents, so we've worked with WM to provide as many options as possible to help meet the needs of the community. With this, we want to say thank you to all the residents who were part of the initial roll out of service. Your feedback has been extremely valuable and was used to help with the rest of the transition. The full transition will provide more options to residents, including additional services throughout the year.

New Recycling Services

Starting in 2024, recycling will become much easier with a single-stream recycling

service. Instead of having multiple bins for recycling, residents will receive one 96-gallon container that all recyclables can be placed in. Materials being recycled will no longer need to be separated and sorted.

New Fall Leaf Pick-Up Program & Holiday Trash Drop-Off

Some feedback we received during the initial roll out was that only having one 96-gallon cart for trash made it difficult to dispose of yard waste during certain times of the year. Starting this year (2023), during the month of November, WM will pick up bagged leaves from all Fruita residents. WM will offer three weeks of leaf clean ups for Fruita residents. They will also be offering a drop-off location after the holiday season for extra household trash. We will provide more information about this new service on our website and on social media when it gets closer. (CONT. PG 2)

MAINTENANCE WEEK AT THE FRUITA COMMUNITY CENTER

September 18-24, 2023 – The entire Fruita Community Center will be closed for maintenance week. The expected re-opening date is Monday, September 25, 2023.



Every fall season, the Fruita Community Center closes for one week so staff can perform routine maintenance and upgrades, including refinishing all the wood floors, carpet cleaning, new paint on the walls, window cleaning, mechanical inspections, and deep cleaning of all workout equipment. In addition, the pool gets drained, power washed, and refilled. New this year, the tile floors in the locker rooms and family changing rooms will be replaced. Please mark your calendars for September 18 - 24 when the entire Fruita Community Center will be closed. The expected re-opening date is Monday, September 25, 2023.

INFORMATION ON ENOCH'S LAKE

The City of Fruita owns four reservoirs on the Pinon Mesa near Glade Park, CO including Enoch's Lake. Prior to 1980, these reservoirs supplied domestic water to the City of Fruita. However, as Fruita grew, these water rights could not adequately serve their historic use. The City now maintains these four reservoirs but has experienced many challenges managing these properties. BACK TO SCHOOL SAFETY

With the start of each new school year, it is important for parents and drivers to be aware of children walking to and from school. Whether students walk, bike, skate, ride or drive to school, it takes all of us to ensure they get there safely.

Walking/Crosswalk Safety Tips:

- Look for traffic at every driveway and intersection. Be aware of drivers in parked cars that may be getting ready to move.
- Obey all traffic signs and signals.

Cross the street safely:

- Stop at the curb or edge of the street.
- Look left, right, behind you and in front of you for traffic.
- Wait until no traffic is coming before you begin crossing.
- Keep looking for traffic until you have finished crossing.
- Walk, don't run, ride or bike across the street.

Driving Precautions to Keep Pedestrians Safe:

- Don't block the crosswalk when stopped at a red light or waiting to make a turn. This forces pedestrians to go around you, which could put them in the path of moving traffic.
- Always stop for a school patrol officer or crossing guard holding up a stop sign.
- Take extra care to look out for children in school zones, near playgrounds and parks, and in all residential areas.
- Never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians.
- Be alert; children are often unpredictable, and they tend to ignore hazards and take risks.

Dropping students off at school:

 Schools often have very specific drop-off procedures for the school year. Make sure you know them for the safety of all students.

The following apply to all school zones:

 Don't double park; it blocks visibility for other children and

vehicles.

- Try to avoid loading or unloading children across the street from the school.
- Carpool to reduce the number of vehicles at the school.

Our children learn by example. Be sure to follow traffic laws and safety tips at all times. Teach your children these rules and then be sure to follow them yourself as a pedestrian and as a driver.
