like to share a few friendly reminders on how to stay safe this summer season.

Lock Your Cars

Fruita is known for being a safe community, but thefts and incidents still happen every day. Cars, specifically unlocked cars, are the perfect crime of opportunity. Thefts from cars are one of the highest calls the Fruita Police Department receives every year. Always lock

your cars, especially at night, and never leave valuables in your car. Car breakins can happen at your house in the middle of the day, in the grocery store parking lot, at the trailhead. Make it a habit to lock your car before you leave!

Here in Fruita, a lot of residents and visitors own dogs. Summers in Fruita get hot with temperatures consistently in the 90 and 100 degree ranges. Never leave your pets in the car unattended,

even if it's only for five minutes. Temperatures inside vehicles increase rapidly and heatstroke can occur within 15 minutes for many dogs. The best practice is to leave your pets at home unless they are coming with you once you reach your destination. Dog owners also need to be aware of pet health outside in the summer heat. If you plan on leaving your dog

outside, always make sure there is plenty of shade and water available. Understanding your dogs breed and health condition will help you know how much heat they can handle. (CONT. PG. 2)

MULBERRY STREET OUTDOOR PLAZA

During the pandemic, the North Mulberry Street closure supported local businesses when indoor seating was limited. Today, the space is an area for residents and visitors to gather in downtown Fruita. After high utilization of the space during the pandemic, the City of Fruita received a Rural Economic Development Initiative (REDI) Grant from the Department of Local Affairs to pursue the option of creating a permanent outdoor gathering space on North Mulberry Street. In April and May of 2022, the City engaged with residents and collected community input with in-person meetings, one on one discussions with local businesses.



and an online survey to determine if the space should be turned into a permanent plaza. The majority of the input collected showed the community wanted to see the space become permanent with new amenities.

Now, construction for the project is complete and the space is ready for the community to enjoy! The space features a firepit, seating, flower beds, shade sails, bike racks, and lighting. When it came to choosing the amenities for the space, the City of Fruita looked towards the local community. Working with local artist Sparks Fly Studio, you will notice the benches, bike racks, flower beds, and firepit were all handmade right here in Fruita. The space also includes two

parking spaces on Aspen Street and two compact parking spaces on the north side of Mulberry Street. The City received a grant from the Colorado Tree Coalition and Xcel Energy Foundation to help plant new trees in Fruita. To add more shade and cooling features, six trees were planted in the middle of the plaza. In the future, residents can expect to see the addition of a kids play feature, a mural, and artwork in the space.

This season, take the time to spend the day in downtown Fruita by supporting local businesses, enjoying the new Mulberry Outdoor Plaza, and spending time with friends and family. To learn more about the project, visit fruita.org.

SENIOR DISCOUNT FOR TRASH SERVICES


The City of Fruita has a senior discount for trash collection and sewer service but there are a few eligibility requirements residents need to meet in order to qualify for



the program. To receive a discount, an individual must be over the age of 62 and have an annual income equal to or less than 133% of the federal poverty level which is \$18,075 for a single and \$24,352 for a couple. The 133% of the federal poverty level is the same eligibility requirement as other federal public assistance programs, such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Medicaid. FIBER INTERNET COMING TO FRUITA

The City of Fruita and the Lower Valley Fire District would like to remind everyone about the risks of wildfires due to rising temperatures, drought, and windy conditions. Homeowners need to take a proactive approach to protecting their homes and residents should follow best practices to help keep the Fruita community safe this fire season.

Fire Safety for Homeowners

If you are a homeowner (or renter), you can make your property less susceptible to a wildfire by making

simple changes today. Start with what is closest to your house. Evaluate anything within zero to five feet of your home. This includes gutters (are they clean?), dead plants, moving items you may store under your porch, and fixing loose or broken windows.

Make sure all propane tanks are at least thirty feet away from your home and free of debris. If you are landscaping this season, think about how you can incorporate fire safety. Create breaks between plants and plant fire wise shrubs and trees.

Cleaning dead shrubs and tree branches from your property is important but please dispose of shrubs and trees properly. If you live behind an open field or the salt wash, do not throw debris in these areas. By adding dead debris to these areas, you are creating an area of opportunity for a wildfire to begin.

Throw debris in trashcans or at the Mesa County Landfill.

Fire Safety for All Residents

Everyone has a responsibility to know and practice fire safety measures. You can be a part of the solution by taking a few simple steps to learn and stay updated on current fire news.

If you are recreating among Colorado's millions of acres of public lands make sure you are aware of current fire restrictions for the area you are in. Do your research before heading out on your next adventure.

Stay up to date on current fire alerts and other emergency alerts by signing up to receive reverse 911 calls from the Grand Junction Communication Center.
