
# **Tuesday's City Council Workshop**

# Election Packets Now Available – DEADLINE JANUARY 22, 2024, 5 pm (Continued)

The City of Fruita's regular election will be held on April 2,2024, and petitions for candidate nominations are now available at the City Clerk's office. There are four open positions in the next election, including the position of Mayor and three City Council seats. Completed petitions must be filed with the City Clerk by January 22, 2024. ### Waste Management Automated Trash Mailer (Continued)

Fruita residents should have received a mailer from Waste Management explaining the transition to the automated collection system. The mailer can be found online at <a href="fruita.org/trashcollection">fruita.org/trashcollection</a>. During the weeks of January 8-26, 2024, a 96-gallon cart will be delivered to Fruita homes if the household doesn't already have one. If a household participates in recycling services, Waste Management will drop off a new 96-gallon recycling container on the household's normal recycling schedule. #### Weekly FAQ

In every weekly update, we will be answering one question we get asked often from the community. These questions will cover a variety of topics from all city departments. - **Question**: Do we have to pay extra for recycling services?
- **Answer:** No, recycling services are free and voluntary. You can opt-in for recycling and your monthly trash bill will stay the same (\$18.90 per month, Senior Rate is \$16.55 per month). If you aren't signed up for recycling but would like to, visit <a href="fruita.org/trashcollection">fruita.org/trashcollection</a>.

## **General Updates**

- November Financial Reports. The financial reports for November 2023 were in the packet for this week's City Council meeting and can be found here: <u>Fruita Financial Reports.</u> Here is a snapshot of the report and sales tax collections for the month of November:
  - City Sales Taxes Were down less than 1% in November, is still trending at an increase of 6% overall compared to the prior year.
  - Use Tax on Motor Vehicles Were down 24% in November, are at a decrease of 9% for 2023 overall.
  - Use Tax on Building Materials Were up 28% in November, trending at a decrease of 10% in 2023 compared to 2022 but has exceeded the budget projections for the year.
  - o **Lodging Taxes** Up 19% in November, at an increase of 2% overall.
  - County Sales Taxes Were up 2% in November, are trending flat compared to 2022.
- *Civic Center Charging Station.* ChargePoint will be on site this afternoon to diagnose and potentially repair the charging station that is showing an unavailable status at the Fruita Civic Center.
- **Downpayment Assistance Program**. Housing Resources now has a State-funded Purchase Assistance Loan program. This program is available throughout Mesa County including Fruita, and can provide up to \$24,000 in Down Payment Assistance loan to households at or below 120% AMI (Area Medium Income). ## **Engineering**

- 19 Road Project Communication. As we prepare for the 19 Road Project, you can expect to see communication from the City of Fruita with project updates, schedules, frequently asked questions, and more. We will be updating the project page online to share as much information as possible with the community. Residents can find the project page at <a href="fruita.org/19road">fruita.org/19road</a>. Communication will also be shared through social media, our quarterly mailer to all residents, a mailer to those who live near the project area, community meetings, the weekly update, and more. - 19 Road Irrigation Open House. To properly update the corridor of 19 Road from J.2 Road south to Highway 6&50 it is going to require some utility upgrades including sewer, stormwater, and irrigation. On Wednesday, we held an irrigation meeting for all the owners on headgate #440 to give them an opportunity to learn about the plans for the irrigation, possible impacts and to answer questions for all those who showed up. We had about 40 people in attendance along with all four members of the City of Fruita Engineering Department. We answered questions

about the design and communicated that the City would be responsible for maintaining all the new infrastructure that will be installed in the Right-of-Way. Some of the other questions that we answered centered around the 19 Road design, intersection design, and plans for traffic lights and stop signs. We encouraged all the participants to contact us at the Engineering department with any questions and concerns that they may have and explained to them that we want to make sure that these upgrades to the irrigation system happen with no negative impacts on any of the share owners.

- South Mesa Street Update. The City of Fruita Engineering Department is working with Rolland Consulting Engineers to update the construction documents to conform with Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) standards. The Federal ARPA funding secured for the construction of this project is administered by CDOT, necessitating this update of the plans. This week marked a milestone in this effort with the submittal of the Field Inspection Review (FIR)(30%) plan set to CDOT. CDOT personnel will review this plan set, and the FIR review meeting is scheduled for February 14, 2024. After the FIR review meeting, the plans will be updated for the Field Office Review (FOR)(90% plans) with CDOT. We expect the entire review process with CDOT to wrap up in fall 2024 with a goal of awarding the project for construction in early winter 2024.
- Fremont Street Project Update. The City of Fruita Engineering Department is working with River City Consultants to update the Right of Way (ROW) Plans to meet Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) requirements. The ROW Plans are being modified to address small parcels that are being cut off from the parent parcel with the designed alignment of Fremont Street. This week marked a milestone in which we received CDOT comments regarding the updated ROW plans. The Engineering Department will work with River City Consultants to address these comments and return the corrected ROW Plans to CDOT for approval.

#### Parks and Recreation

- Aquatics. On January 16, the aquatic staff kicked off the first session of 2024 swim Lessons and Gators Youth Conditioning. With almost every class full, the program is off to a great start! The Youth Diving classes have also reached near maximum capacity and are set to begin on January 24th! The Aquatics Division has added six new employees to the team: two lifeguards, two swimming instructors, and two water aerobics instructors!
- Guest Services. The updated 2024 Fees went into effect this week. The transition was smooth
  and seamless, due to the tireless efforts of the front desk staff actively communicating the
  increase.
- **FCC Maintenance.** The retile project began in the men's locker room. The contractor is already ahead of schedule with demo taking less than a day. We are optimistic that the whole project will stay on track and potentially ahead of schedule.

#### **Police Department**

• Calls for Service Statistics. Closing out the year, the Grand Junction Regional Communications Center logged a total of 11,234 calls for service for the Fruita Police Department, compared with 8,695 for 2023, reflecting a 29% increase. It should be noted that the majority of that increase results from a change in the way we are tracking officer initiated activities.

- **AED Installation.** Building Maintenance assisted with the installation of AED's throughout the various city facilities.
- CDL Training. Wyatt Bramwell successfully completed his CDL training. Congratulations Wyatt!
- **FOG Training.** Utilities staff and Wastewater Treatment staff attended a Fats Oil Grease (FOG) Abatement Program Training sponsored by the USDA.

- **Biofilter Testing.** Hensel Phelps was on site with the Biofilter manufacturer to begin the testing period of the biofilter equipment installed for the H2S project.
- Stakeholder Meetings. City staff and I met virtually with Xcel Energy representatives to discuss projects in the City of Fruita, and specifically address accurate locating for their gas lines and promptness or road repairs following utility repairs. Public Works Director attended the Colorado Microgrid Roadmap Stakeholder Engagement meeting for the Norther and Northwest Regions. Attended the School District 51 Long Range Facilities Planning meeting.
