Tuesday's City Council Meeting

19 Road Communications | First Mailer Sent

We are working on communication efforts for the upcoming 19 Road construction later this year. The project schedule can be found online, and residents can expect more reminder notices and other updates from the city as we get closer to the project start date (November 2024). The first big communication push happened this week with a notification mailer sent to property owners near the project area (between Highway 6&50, from Peach Street to 19 ½ Road, and north to Ottley Avenue). Below is the mailer content that was sent to property owners this week. A second mailer will be sent closer to the project start date. We will be updating the project page online to share as much information as possible with the community. Residents can find the project page at fruita.org/19road. Communication will also be shared through social media, our quarterly mailer to all residents, a mailer to those who live near the project area, community meetings, the weekly update, and more. Road Construction Coming this Year

19 Road from Highway 6&50 north to J 2/10 Road *Expected to begin in early November and last until summer 2025.*

You are receiving this mailer because your address is near the project area (between Highway 6&50, from Peach St. to 19 ó Rd., and north to Ottley Ave.).

The City of Fruita is planning the following improvements to 19 Road:

- Sanitary sewer installation from the canal north to J.2 Rd.
- Storm drain installation from the canal north to J.2 Rd.
- Irrigation line and structure improvements at J Rd. and J.2 Rd.
- including the replacement of the line along the west edge of 19 Rd.
- from J Rd. south to Iron Drive.
- Road widening
- Pedestrian path installation

Full road closures will occur throughout the project. The recommended detour route is from J Road and using 20 Road. Please visit fruita.org/19road for more project information, frequently asked questions, and project updates. We appreciate your patience while we make improvements.

- Question: What are the community's core values & how does the city utilize these values?
- **Answer:** In 2019, over 4,000 residents participated in the Fruita in Motion Comprehensive Plan process. The plan outlines a vision, goals, policies, and action for the City of Fruita. Through this process, a list of community values emerged. A few of these values include, that residents love living in Fruita, love its small-town feel, and they want to preserve these


values far into the future. These values are at the core of the city's vision, goals, and policies not only throughout the Fruita in Motion Comprehensive Plan but throughout every project and service, the city provides to the community. The following vision was created for the city based on the community values: "The City of Fruita values quality of place. It's an inclusive city, with a small-town feel and vibrant downtown, surrounded by public lands. People love to live, work, and play in Fruita because the City facilitates community, safe neighborhoods, family-friendly events, and walking and biking. The City governs in a way that's responsive to its citizens and prioritizes high-impact services and projects. Fruita fosters a fun and funky ambiance around the arts, agriculture, and recreation." General Updates

- **City Council Candidate Orientation.** I appreciate all the candidates for attending the orientation Thursday night and also Council member Purser for being there to help as well. We covered a lot of ground and grateful for their willingness to serve the community.
- **Fun Fruita Local Video.** Happy Friday! <u>Enjoy this short video</u> where you'll hear from Fruita locals on why they chose to live in Fruita.

Engineering

- 19 Road Right-of-Way surveying. During the weeks of February 12 and February 19, residents can expect to see surveyors (trucks and survey signs) working along 19 Road as part of the right-of-way acquisition for the 19 Road construction project. The surveyors will work from Highway 6&50 to J 2/10 Road. There should be limited to no traffic impacts for this work.
- **Deeply Digital/Clearnetworx Update.** Clearnetworx/Deeply Digital started blowing fiber cables through the conduit that has been installed throughout Fruita. This is one of the last steps before their services are turned on for use. The company still has work to do in Fruita over the next few months, but progress is being made every day.
- Ottley Road closure for Rose Creek Subdivision construction. Ottley Avenue will be closed starting Thursday, February 8. The road closure is expected to last for 30 days. The contractor for the Rose Creek Subdivision will begin by milling (removing the asphalt surface) the existing road to facilitate installation of utilities. Work will also include installation of storm sewer facilities and curb, gutter and sidewalk along Ottley Avenue. The recommended detour route is south on Pine Street to J Road (Wildcat Ave.), east to 19 Road, then north on 19 Road to Ottley Avenue (K Road). Ottley Avenue will reopen to traffic once utility work is completed, however; there will be a future road closure once the asphalt plants open in the spring and the road can be repaved. Please check fruita.org/projects under the Rose Creek Final Plat for updates on this road closure.



• **Highway 340 Trail Connection.** The Request for Proposals went out Friday for the design of the trail connection from the state park, under the Highway 340 bridge at the Colorado River, and then north to the trail that currently terminates at Red Cliffs Dr. Responses are due February 28, 2024.

Parks and Recreation

- Reed Park Update. 90% of the storm water on the wheel park has been completed. The masons
 are on site and have begun the block work for the building. Ute water will begin installing the
 new water tap and the removal of the old water tap next week. Site electrical work will begin in
 the grass area starting next week as well. The lumber and framing will begin when masonry is
 completed.
- Monthly Attendance and Usage. January 2024 attendance at the FCC rose to an all-time high of 19,687. Up 15% over last year, the facility welcomed 2,962 more guests and members than last year at this time.

- Aquatics Department and Programming. The Water Fitness classes continue to gain popularity
 and have reached capacity on most days. To accommodate the demand for these aerobic
 opportunities, two instructors have been hired, and additional morning classes are now offered
 every Friday! SCUBA classes have been extremely popular in 2024. Discover SCUBA and Full
 SCUBA classes have reached full occupancy before the registration deadline!
- Increase in Silver and Fit Attendance. The number of Silver and Fit, Silver Sneakers, and ReNew Active members was exceptional this month totaling almost 3,700 of the total 20,000 visits in January. With the increase of participants in our 55+ classes, additional staff and Silver Sneaker® class times have been added to accommodate the overflow of wanting participants.
- **Retiling Project Update.** The Men's locker room section was completed Wednesday, January 31, and reopened for use to our members this morning. Not skipping a beat, Creative Tile Solutions began the demo of the Women's locker room. The timeline for completion of the total project is still on course with the current section estimated for completion on February 15.
- **Planting bed cleanup.** Parks crews will be cleaning and trimming planting beds throughout the City. The mild weather has allowed crews to get a jump start on the spring clean-up.
- Graffiti on Railroad Bridge. Crews painted over graffiti on the railroad bridge on Wednesday.
- **Snooks Bottom Bench.** Parks crews finished the installation and replacement of the damaged bench at Snooks Bottom.
