2024 Regular City of Fruita Municipal Election – April 2, 2024

The City of Fruita regular municipal election will be held on April 2, 2024, and will be conducted by mail ballot. Ballots will be sent out to registered voters next week, and residents can mail their completed ballots or turn them in at the drop-off box at the Fruita Civic Center parking lot (325 E. Aspen Ave.). • **Question**: Do I need a business license in the City of Fruita?

• **Answer:** If you are doing business in the City of Fruita, you need to have a business license. You may find the business license application on this website under <u>Business Licenses</u>. You may also pick up the application at the City Clerk's Office at the Fruita Civic Center, 325 E. Aspen, Fruita, CO. The annual fee for a business license is \$30.00, payable by check, cash or credit card. You will receive a renewal form in the mail at the end of each calendar year for the following year.

General Updates

- *Ride the Rockies*. On Tuesday, Ride the Rockies (RTR) staff were in town for a site visit for their event on June 14-15, 2024. The six day race will end in Fruita with celebrations including live music, food trucks, special events, and more. The RTR team will be in Fruita once per month leading up to the event to connect with partners and finalize logistics for the event.
- **Supervisor Training**. Every quarter, we host a supervisor training internally for staff. This week's training covered internal communication channels and a presentation from Employment and Labor Attorney Michael Santo, of Bechtel and Santo. Michael provided training on new laws and requirements on personnel for the Supervisors. Michael also was available to answer questions from staff on these topics and others.
- Lower Valley Fire Department Training. It was a pleasure to spend a morning with the leadership team of the Lower Valley Fire District and train on Leadership, management, and decision –making this week. I truly appreciate their dedication and service to the community.
- *GJEP Economic Summit.* This year's annual Mesa County Economic Summit, hosted by the Grand Junction Economic Partnership, is scheduled for Tuesday, April 16, at Colorado Mesa University. - **Clearnetworx Fiber Internet Info Session.** Clearnetworx is hosting an open house next Wednesday, March 13 at 3 pm at the Fruita Community Center. They will be answering common questions about construction, installation, and restoration.



Engineering

• **Right of Way Acquisition RFP**. The engineering department is reviewing questions received for the right of way acquisition RFP. The purpose of the RFP is to have a firm available for future projects that require right of way acquisition. Future projects include improvements to J Road, J.2 Road, J.6 Road, and 19 Road from J.2 to K Road.

- **Design Work for J Road.** Staff is working on the design for the future improvement to J Road.
- *Interviews.* Staff participated in interviews this week to hire an engineering firm for contracted work.

Marketing and Promotion

- Colorado Tourism Office Photoshoot This Spring. On Thursday morning, our Communications and Marketing staff had a kickoff meeting with staff from the Colorado Tourism Office on an upcoming photo/video shoot of Fruita. As part of the Reimagine Destinations grant that Fruita and the Town of Palisade received for the marketing partnership in 2022, both destinations are receiving a photoshoot to collect photo and video assets in the value of \$30,000. The photoshoot is tentatively scheduled for this spring and will focus on expanding advertising assets with new types of activities and assets of local businesses. We are excited to work with the Colorado Tourism Office on this project and are thankful for their ongoing support and partnership of our marketing efforts.
- Imondi Wake Zone to Host World Wake Association Event. Exciting news this week, the Grand Junction Sports Commission announced that the World Wake Association will be bringing the Colorado State Championships of Wakeboard to Imondi Wake Zoon in June. The event will take place from June 28-30, and an excited 200 athletes from around the County will participate in the event. We are very excited to be hosting this event in Fruita and look forward to working with the World Wake Association in the future. Learn more about the World Wake Association event online.

Parks and Recreation

- *Waterslide Construction*. Starting Monday, March 11, a portion of the indoor pool deck area will be blocked off for construction. Don't worry! The construction will not impact the actual pool. In addition, you will see a few parking spots blocked off early Monday morning on the north side of the building. This portion of construction is anticipated to last through May.
- **Reed Park Update.** Sheathing and lumbing rough in is completed. Mechanical rough in should be starting next week followed by electrical rough in the following week. Additional electrical site work has started and should be completed mid-week. Concrete forms and flatwork to begin around the shelter and playground in anticipation of the playground installation the first week of April. The building is only a couple of days behind due to weather but we are a month ahead of schedule on site work.

Police Department

- **Calls for Service Statistics.** In February 2024, the Grand Junction Regional Communications Center logged 926 calls for service for the Fruita Police Department. This compares with 791 calls for service in February 2023, showing a 17% increase. Year to date, we are at 2,020 calls for service in 2024 compared with 1,805 this time last year, showing a 12% increase.
