19 ROAD IMPROVEMENTS (COMING FALL 2024)

The City of Fruita is planning utility and roadway improvements along 19 Road. from Highway 6 & 50 north to J.2 Road. The improvements are expected to begin after the irrigation season in early November and last until summer 2025. Improvements are expected to consist of the following:

- Sanitary sewer installation from the canal north to J.2 Rd.
- Storm drain installation from the canal north to J.2 Rd.
- Irrigation line and structure improvements at J Rd. and J.2 Rd., including the replacement of the line along the west edge of 19 Rd. from J Rd. south to Iron Drive
- Road widening
- · Pedestrian path installation

Work associated with the project will begin in early fall. You can expect slowdowns and traffic control. Please check back for more updates on specific street closures.

Construction (utility work and road work) will start after irrigation water is shut off for the season (early to mid-November) and is expected to last until early to midsummer 2025.

GEARING UP FOR IRRIGATION



Irrigation water is typically turned on around the first of April and crews will be working to get the City's irrigation systems up and running as soon as possible. To assist in the startup of irrigation season, residents are reminded to make sure ditches are cleaned and valves (that were used to drain pumps and irrigation systems for winter) are closed prior to April 1.

Please keep in mind that most newer subdivisions are not connected to the City's irrigation system and are supplied water through their Homeowners Association. Residents are encouraged to make sure they know who to contact with questions about their irrigation systems, especially in an emergency situation. We recognize recent fiber internet construction may have inadvertently impacted some irrigation lines. If you suspect damage to your irrigation system, especially in areas where there was digging, please contact Clearnetworx directly at 970-240-6600.
