General Updates

• *Fruita Academy Week #3.* This week, the Fruita Academy focused on Community Development and the Police Department. The group learned about plan review, the Building Division, Short Term Rentals, special events, new economic development efforts, and an in-depth overview of the Police Department. Next week is our last week of the academy and it will cover administration and elected officials.

- Bike to Work Day & Breakfast at the Fruita Civic Center. Next week, staff and I will be hosting Fruita Bike to Work Day at City Hall at 7:30 a.m. After breakfast, we will head out for a quick ride around Fruita on one of the Fruita wayfinding routes. We look forward to seeing everyone and of course want to thank the sponsors of the breakfast, Einstein Bagels and Bestslope Coffee.
- *Fruita Fourth Friday Tonight.* The first Fruita Fourth Friday of the year is tonight! Head down to the Mulberry Plaza for to enjoy community, art, music, food, and drink.
- **Grand Valley Pets Alive Update.** This year, the Fruita City Council approved \$6,000 in outside agency funding for Grand Valley Pets Alive ("GVPA") to issue spay and neuter vouchers for Fruita residents. GVPA sent us a letter this week providing us with an update on the grant this year that can be found below. Through April, almost \$4,000 of the grant has been used for vouchers and there is another \$2,000 in vouchers that are waiting that have been distributed but not redeemed. The letter concludes by thanking the City of Fruita for the grant, and that it is making a huge difference in the community. Thank you to GVPA for all that you do!
- *City of Fruita Awarded Mini-Grant.* The City of Fruita has been awarded a \$5,000 from the Associated Governments of Northwest Colorado ("AGNC") for crosswalk improvements on Cherry Street next to Family Health West. The improvements will include the removal of the existing curb and gutters to construct a new ADA ramp compliant ramp, creating and installing new signage, and stripping the crosswalk and curb faces. Thank you to AGNC for your support with this project!
- *Member Appreciation Social.* The annual Fruita Area Chamber of Commerce Member Appreciation Social is next Wednesday, May 1, 2024, at 3:30 p.m. If you are interested in attending, you find more information here: <u>Chamber Member Appreciation Social</u>.
- Lower Valley Fire Mitigation. Starting Monday, April 29, until Thursday, May 2, the Lower Valley Fire District and Alpine Tree Services will continue work along the Little Salt Wash from Almond Circle to the Maple Street Bridge removing brush to help with fire mitigation.

Parks and Recreation

- **Reed Park Update.** Wheelpark rough grade has begun, and American Ramp Company is starting to prep for concrete. The wheelpark is taking shape and starting to look like something other than piles of dirt. The north shelter foundation has begun and will be fenced off during construction. Ute Water will be closing Elm on Monday and Tuesday to relocate the fire hydrant to the west side of Elm and moving the water meter to a location that will provide maintenance accessibility. The landscaping contractor is fixing all damaged irrigation and splicing damaged irrigation wires. They are working to get all repairs made so they can start irrigating the park.
- **Downtown Restroom Construction started this week.** The contractor has completed the site prep and we are working on a delivery date for the installation of the restroom. It is looking like mid-May for a delivery date.

- **Community Center Waterslide Update.** The contractor is continuing underground plumbing and working with the Health Department on operational details for the waterslide. Work is on schedule and progressing according to the construction timeline.
- **Puzzle Palooza.** Fruita Parks and Recreation hosted our first ever Puzzle Palooza on April 7th, with 11 teams competing to complete a 500-piece jigsaw puzzle. Teams consisted of people aged from 17- 81! The winning team completed the puzzle in 26minutes and 40 seconds!
- **Youth Activities.** Last Friday was another successful Night of FCC event. With 317 5th-7th graders in attendance.
- **Athletics.** 44 participants learned the fundamentals of soccer including teamwork, and sportsmanship in our Pee Wee soccer program. Pee Wee soccer will resume in June.
- Active Adults (55+). As the spring weather warms up so do the Active Adults (55+) hikes and trips. This month, the group hiked Otto's trail on the Colorado National Monument and spent some time at the Monument's visitor center learning about John Otto. During our hike on 4/23 to the Audobon Trail, we saw Mrs. Albertson (A great horned owl) and her babies in their nest! Last Wednesday, the Fruita Active Adults (55+) spent the day at Ouray Hot Springs.

A much belated THANKS to the City of Fruita for the \$6000 grant from Outside Agency Funding.

Grand Valley Pets Alive has been very busy this year, we are running behind on getting Thanks out to those supporting us.

On January 16 we issued the first voucher for Fruita. As of April 11, \$3660 has been paid out, and another \$2156 is on the books as "active vouchers". Active vouchers are similar to checks, waiting to be cashed, they have an expiration date of approximately 45 days. Any that expire puts the dollar amount back in the grant, to issue more vouchers. It is our wish that all vouchers issued be used, sadly not all are. Vouchers for the approximate balance of \$184 will be issued by the end of this week.

The City of Fruita's grant is making a big difference.
