Tuesday's City Council Workshop

We have a full workshop scheduled for Tuesday night. We will begin our meeting with an update from the Planning and Development Department on the short-term rental program and the progress of the Granicus compliance software. After that, the City Council will continue the discussion on the Localism Committee, and then have a broad discussion on Secondhand Tax Plan that has been proposed throughout the valley. The final item will be how the City Council would like to allocate the proceeds from the sale of Enoch Lake for a community benefit, before reviewing two proclamation requests. Tree City USA

We are excited to share that the City of Fruita has been recognized as a 2023 Tree City USA. Tree City USA is a partnership between the Arbor Day Foundation, the U.S. Forest Service, and the National Association of State Foresters. Fruita achieves Tree City USA recognition by meeting the program's four requirements: maintaining a tree board or department, having a tree care ordinance, dedicating an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita, and hosting an Arbor Day observance and proclamation.

2024 Regular City of Fruita Municipal Election - April 2, 2024 - Ballots Mailed

The City of Fruita regular municipal election will be held on April 2, 2024, and will be conducted by mail ballot. Ballots will be reaching resident's mailboxes in the next several days. Here's what residents needs to know:

- Ballots must be returned by 7:00 p.m. on April 2, 2024. Mail ballot drop boxes are located in the Civic Center parking lot and the lobby inside the Civic Center (325 E. Aspen Ave.).
- Not sure if you are registered to vote? You can check your registration status at www.govotecolorado.gov.
- If you don't receive a ballot and are a registered voter residing in the Fruita city limits, please contact the City Clerk's office at 970 639 4210 or dwoods@fruita.org.
- If your ballot is lost, spoiled or destroyed, please contact the City Clerk's office for a replacement ballot.

General Updates

• **GVT Seeking Feedback on Proposed Service Changes.** The Grand Valley Transit ("GVT") is currently inviting public input regarding two proposals for changes to Saturday service hours. The first proposal reduces Saturday service hours for each route by two hours, and the second proposal reduces each service route by 6 hours. Parks and Recreation

- Reed Park Update. Concrete has been poured for the half-moon shape sidewalk dividing the playground, flatwork around the building, and walking area west of the building. The glulam trusses have been set and final timber work should be completed by the end of next week. HVAC rough should be completed this week with inspections taking place next week. Playground installation will begin on April 1st and Minipitch installation will begin April 9th.
- **Parks Update.** The Parks Department is continuing to clean out planters along Highway 6&50 and in the roundabouts. The sunshades are being hung above the playground equipment in the north and south play areas at the Little Salt Wash Park.
- Youth Activities Updates. Dinomites Spring Break was action packed this week with swimming, crafts, games, and fun-filled days at the Fruita Community Cener with 15 kids per day. Dinomites Summer Camp registration opens on Monday, March 25, in-person only at the Fruita Community Center from 4-6 pm.
- **Youth Athletics Update.** Future Cats Basketball Camp had another successful spring break camp with 40 registered! Youth Soccer (K-8) kicks off next week with 240 participants. Pee Wee Soccer (4-5 years) starts in April; currently there are 40 kids registered.
- *Thank you, Fruita Rotary!* Fruita Parks and Recreation accepted a \$2,500 Title Sponsor for the Youth Scholarship golf Tournament on March 19 from the Fruita Rotary Club.
- **Senior Activities.** Active Adults (55+) took a spring break adventure to Moab for a Hummer Safari Trip.

Attended Senator Bennet and Senator Hickenlooper's webinar regarding Congressionally Directed Spending applications and completed the DOLA grant application for a sewer line replacement project.
