Re: WEEKLY INFO UPDATE

City Offices are closed Monday, February15 in observance of President's Day.

Our hearts go out to the Mesa County Sheriff's Department and especially the Geer family regarding the tragic loss of Deputy Geer who gave the ultimate sacrifice while protecting our valley and reminds us of the incredible service and risk our law enforcement public servants make on our behalf. Funeral services will be Monday, Feb. 15 at 1 pm at Canyon View Vineyard Church.

We have had calls and questions as to why our flags are not at half-staff. In case you are getting the same questions or have them yourself, we are only to place flags at half-staff by order of the President or the Governor. We have received this order to do so on Monday, Feb. 15 in coordination with the funeral.

Tuesday Night's City Council Meeting

Tuesday night the consent agenda includes liquor license renewals. Also included is a resolution adopting a policy for funding requests from outside agencies as discussed in a previous workshop and we were directed to add onto an upcoming meeting for adoption. This is the policy that sets forth a process for outside agencies to formally request in time for the budget process to have all requests. This does not include marketing and promotion requests. It does however clarify that city funds are not spent toward things such as tables/tickets for fundraising events. A budget resolution for a supplemental appropriation for 2016, January financial reports and two resolutions regarding phase 2(b) for Brandon Estates are also included in the consent agenda. There are no public hearings or administrative updates scheduled. I plan to provide an update to City Council in the near future on the Gateway Enhancement Project as we narrow down the next steps.

All candidates will have an opportunity to answer questions first, in a rotating format, answers will be limited to 90 seconds each. Please reply to me if you would like to participate. TID BITS:

- The PD has been assisting the Sheriff's Department during the aftermath of the tragic loss of Deputy Geer.
- New surveillance cameras purchased by the Forfeiture Board have been installed and are operating at the PD and Municipal Court.
- Staff is coordinating with the Outdoor Recreation Coalition and Luis Benitez for the next gathering that will occur in Fruita on Feb. 22. We will give Luis a tour and there will be a happy hour event at the Hot Tomato from 5:30 7:30 pm.
- As part of our overlay and chip seal program this year (later summer/fall) we will be installing a new crosswalk on Coulson.
- Jeff Bates' bike corrals are currently at the powder coater and when ready will be installed downtown.
- Sweetheart Run and Health Expo is tomorrow at the FCC beginning at 10 am. Looks like the weather will be just right. The FCC will still operate with the exception of the gymnasium that the expo will be in.
- We met with Mesa County, BLM, COPMOBA Grand Valley Trails Alliance and CMU to discuss
 Mesa County taking the lead in a possible state grant opportunity for connecting communities
 to public lands in an effort to connect Fruita to 18 Road trails or at least in a first phase seek to
 pave the dirt road out there.
- The J.2 Road pre-bid meeting is Monday at 3 pm with bid opening Friday the 18th.
- Sorter Construction attempted to work on the Mulberry sewer project but the ground was too wet and we will wait until it is near paving time to finish out the asphalt.
- We will begin advertising the consultant selection Sunday for the design of the Kokopelli Section of the Riverfront Trail.
- The field work for geo-tech was completed for the Kokopelli Trail section.
- The Little Salt Wash Trail construction began this week.
- We received bids for completing the interior of the City Shops building and the bids were higher than budget, so staff is working to adjust the scope to fit the budget.
- The GVDD and the 5-2-1 Authority met this week to begin looking at alternatives for fees. There will be a meeting on March 10th to present to elected officials the results of this process.
- The election and ballot question have been finalized and approved by the County.
- Staff completed the initial priority based budgeting training focused on program inventory today and will spend the next 2-3 weeks developing the first draft of inventory for the consultants.
- I participated in a panel today to speak to the Club 20 Tourism Committee regarding fruit and bike tourism.


