



As a community, we have made incredible progress against COVID-19. "Be Well, Be Fruita" is an effort to continue this progress, to support and keep our businesses open, to assist our schools with safe, outdoor learning spaces, and to strive to keep our families, friends, and neighbors safe. now and in the future. The "Be Well, Be Fruita" campaign and efforts are funded through coronavirus relief funds. More information can be found at fruita.org/bewell.

The City of Fruita is spending these funds on four areas of eligible expenses: (1) operational expenses, (2) education assistance (3) community assistance expenses and (4) economic recovery.

- Operations Expenses to keep staff and community members safe such as increased safety precautions, personal protective equipment, extensive cleaning, hosting remote meetings, and telecommuting. We're prepared should another outbreak occur.
- Education The City is working with the school district to create outdoor

- classrooms and socially distanced learning opportunities at Fruita schools.
- Community Providing timely and accurate communication to our community, Fruita businesses and guests. Working with non-profit partners to provide resources for those in need.
- Economic To help Fruita businesses, the City is creating outdoor spaces for customers of downtown and southside businesses.

And remember, each of us can continue to build upon this progress by following these five simple steps:

- Maintain a bike's distance apart

### Building Better Trails Together — Mesa County Awarded Trails Maintenance Grant



Last fall, the City of Fruita partnered with COPMOBA, the Bureau of Land Management, Over the Edge Fruita, the Hot Tomato, the Western Colorado Conservation Corps and other partners (collectively, the "Fruita Trails Initiative") to fund a trails maintenance crew for six weeks. Over those six weeks, crews completed work at the Kokopelli Trail System and the North Fruita Desert (18 Road) repairing trails, fixing drainage, building rock structures and revegetating braided trails systems. The maintenance

was focused on trail resiliency and rideability on many of our popular trails. It was a great success.

Based upon these successes, we are excited to announce that Mesa County was recently awarded a Resilient Communities Grant from Great Outdoors Colorado, which will fund another trails maintenance crew in the Grand Valley through 2022! We are pleased to see this program receive the resources to support its growth. ©

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# Fruita Community Center Update

### The Fruita Community Center remains open and ready for you to use.

Since re-opening in May after a 6-week closure due to COVID-19, the Fruita Community Center (FCC) has provided a safe and clean environment for exercise. With the help of the Mesa County Health Department (MCPH), we re-opened with a strict policy on cleaning and disinfecting, which we have been and will continue to follow. We also implemented a reservation system to regulate the amount of patrons who are in the FCC at any one time. Now that the State of Colorado and MCPH have eased their guidelines, we no longer require the use of the reservation system with the exception of the swimming pool lap lanes and water aerobics. In addition, we are excited that MCPH has eased the guidelines for wearing masks while exercising indoors. While we still ask that you wear a mask while entering, exiting and circulating in and around the FCC, you may take your mask off to exercise once you are at your workout station. Please continue

to be courteous to your fellow FCC patrons and follow these new guidelines. In other news:

- Pickle ball is back! Monday Thursday 6am to 11am - please bring your own paddle.

- It has taken some time, but the indoor pool was replastered and looks like a brand-new pool! It is ready for people to swim in it - in all of its glory!
