# APRIL 2020

The next regular City election will be held on April 7, 2020. The election will be conducted by mail ballot and ballots will be mailed out to registered voters the week of March 16, 2020. The City of Fruita now has a 24-hour mail ballot drop box located in the Civic Center east parking lot where you can drive right up to drop off your ballot.

The ballot will include the election of a Mayor and three City Council members. There is one candidate running unopposed for Mayor and three candidates for the three Council positions available.

In addition, there will also be a ballot issue concerning whether or not the City of Fruita should increase its Lodger's Tax by an additional 3%. The Fruita Area Chamber of Commerce will be hosting a Candidate Forum on Thursday, March 5, 2020 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. at the Fruita Community Center (FCC) at 324 N. Coulson. ### REFERRED ISSUE A

SHALL THE CITY OF FRUITA LODGER'S TAX
BE INCREASED BY ONE HUNDRED FIFTY
THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000) IN THE
FIRST YEAR (2021), AND BY WHATEVER
ADDITIONAL AMOUNTS ARE RAISED ANNUALLY THEREAFTER, BY THE ADOPTION OF AN
ADDITIONAL THREE PERCENT (3%) TAX ON
THE PRICE PAID FOR LODGING IN THE CITY,
WITH THE ADDITIONAL THREE PERCENT (3%)
TAX COLLECTED IN THE SAME MANNER AS
THE CITY'S LODGER'S TAX; WITH ALL OR ANY
PORTION OF THE NET PROCEEDS OF THE ADDITIONAL 3% LODGER'S TAX, AS DETERMINED
BY THE CITY COUNCIL, BEING COLLECTED,
RETAINED AND SPENT TO FUND:

- PARKS, TRAILS AND OPEN SPACE AND PUBLIC PLACES, SUCH REVENUE TO BE EXPENDED TO FINANCE THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OF PARKS, OPEN SPACE AND TRAILS AND PUB-LIC PLACES WITHIN AND OUTSIDE THE CITY;

### Parks, Health, Recreation, Open Space and Trails

### (PHROST) MASTER PLAN

The City of Fruita recently adopted a new Comprehensive Plan for our community. Now that we have a long-range document that outlines our community's values and strategies, we are turning our attention to updating our Parks, Open Space and Trails Master Plan which will delve deeper into our Parks and Recreation system. This time we are adding the elements of Health and Recreation and calling it a PHROST Master Plan —Yes, as in PHAT or way cool!

GreenPlay LLC, the consultant hired to help us develop this plan, was recently in town to begin the process. They met with over 50 partner and stakeholder groups in the community as well as over 100 community members at a Public Forum at the Cavalcade in downtown Fruita. It had a great turnout! In addition, GreenPlay staff has been inventorying our programs, events and all parks and recreational facilities (utilizing GIS). They are also reviewing all our documentation, policies and procedures, participation rates and anything else they can to determine our current

levels of service for parks and recreation in Fruita.

In early April, a random sample survey will be sent out to the community asking further questions about existing services and possible new ones. If you get a survey, please take the time to respond; it is very important to hear from our community. In early July, GreenPlay will be back in Fruita to present findings. We will then start to develop strategies to address any issues and deficiencies we have within our Parks and Recreation system. We plan to have the PHROST Master Plan draft ready in September with the final plan adoption by City Council in November.
