WHEREAS, the Grand Junction High School's building is over 65 years old and has numerous safety concerns, including but not limited to asbestos exposure, sinking infrastructure, a plethora of entrances, and extensive rain damage; and

WHEREAS, the School District 51 Board of Education has gone through the necessary steps to provide the voter a cost-effective and transparent bond measure with the sole purpose of rebuilding Grand Junction High School, and the District will only borrow up to the amount approved by the voters; and

WHEREAS, the School District used an advisory group drawn from expert community members to find numerous ways to make the project more fiscally efficient, and adopted many of those recommendations; and

WHEREAS, a new Grand Junction High School would not only provide the necessary infrastructure for students to continue to thrive academically, but would also serve as a hub for the community and aid in the growth of our economy by attracting and retaining a variety of businesses, healthcare professionals, and families
